Small Entity Compliance Guide

Dear Northeast (NE) Multispecies Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you that a proposed emergency rule has been published in the <u>Federal</u> <u>Register</u> soliciting comments on management measures for the NE multispecies fishery (for both the commercial and recreational fisheries). The management measures under consideration would be in place for the period beginning July 28, 2003, and ending on the date Amendment 13 to the NE Multispecies Fishery Management Plan is implemented, which is expected to be May 1, 2004.

The proposed measures would continue the current rules that were implemented on August 1, 2002, consistent with the Settlement Agreement and adopted by a Court Order in <u>Conservation</u> <u>Law Foundation, et al. v. Evans et al</u>. In addition the rule proposes a Days-at-Sea (DAS) leasing program that would allow limited access multispecies permit holders to lease DAS, subject to certain restrictions. You may be sent additional information (specific instructions and an application) in the near future to expedite the administration of this program in the event it is implemented.

If you hold a NE multispecies limited access permit, your multispecies DAS allocation for the new fishing year beginning May 1, 2003, will be the same as the allocation of DAS that you received under the August 1, 2002, interim groundfish action. In contrast to last year, during the period May through July 2003, DAS use will not be limited to 25% of the annual allocation. Only vessels that have obtained a Day gillnet designation and that fish under a NE multispecies DAS with gillnet gear are subject to the differential DAS accounting rule under which trips greater than 3 hours, but less than or equal to 15 hours, will be counted as 15 hours.
