SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

Dear Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you that the National Marine Fisheries Service (NOAA Fisheries) has implemented Framework Adjustment 3 (Framework 3) to the Summer Flounder, Scup, and Black Sea Bass Fishery Management Plan. The final rule will be published in the <u>Federal Register</u> on **November 3, 2003**. Framework 3 is intended to improve management of the commercial scup fishery.

The final rule: 1) Allows the rollover of unused commercial scup quota from the Winter I period to the Winter II period (effective **November 1, 2003**); and 2) allows scup landings from April 15 through April 30 in a state by state-only permitted vessels fishing exclusively in that state's waters to be counted against the Summer period quota during years in which the Winter I period is closed by April 15, if authorized by the Regional Administrator (effective April 1, 2004).

For 2003, 1,873,050 lb remain of the Winter I quota. This amount is added to the current Winter II quota of 1,979,689 lb, resulting in the following changes:

- The 2003 Winter II quota is increased to 3,852,739 lb.
- The 2003 Winter II possession limit is increased to 4,000 lb per trip.

Note: In cases where state possession limits for scup differ from the Federal possession limit, federally permitted vessels are required to abide by the more restrictive state or Federal measure.
