## SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

## REOPENING OF THE 2002 DIRECTED <u>LOLIGO</u> SQUID FISHERY

Dear Atlantic Mackerel, Squid, and/or Butterfish Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you that the directed fishery for <u>Loligo</u> squid in the exclusive economic zone will be reopened, effective 0001 hours, December 2, 2002, through 0001 hours, December 12, 2002. This reopening will allow the fishery participants to receive the full benefit of the annual quota allocation. Vessels issued a Federal moratorium permit to harvest <u>Loligo</u> squid in excess of the incidental catch allowance may resume fishing for, retaining and landing <u>Loligo</u> squid in excess of the incidental catch allowance at 0001 hours, December 2, 2002. The fishery will remain open, and landings may be made until 0001 hours, December 12, 2002.

After 0001 hours, December 12, 2002, the directed fishery for <u>Loligo</u> squid will be closed and vessels issued Federal permits for <u>Loligo</u> squid may not retain or land more than 2,500 lb of <u>Loligo</u> squid per trip or per calendar day. This incidental catch limit restriction will cease at 0001 hours, January 1, 2003, at which time the 2003 Quarter I quota for the <u>Loligo</u> squid fishery will become available.
