Dear Atlantic Mackerel, Squid, and/or Butterfish Permit Holder:

This letter announces final initial specifications for the 2002 fishing year for Atlantic mackerel, squid, and butterfish, as follows:

DISTRIBUTION OF ANNUAL LOLIGO QUOTA

The annual Loligo quota (DAH) will be sub-divided into quarterly periods, as follows:

In addition, the directed fishery will be closed in Quarters I-III when 80 percent of the period's allocation is harvested, with vessels restricted to a 2,500-lb <u>Loligo</u> trip limit until the end of the respective quarter. Additionally, when 95 percent of the total annual DAH has been harvested, the trip limit will be reduced to 2,500-lb of <u>Loligo</u> for the remainder of the year. In both cases where the 2,500-lb trip limit has been triggered, vessels will be prohibited from possessing or landing more than 2,500-lb in a single <u>day</u>. Any quota overage in Quarter I will be deducted from the allocation in Quarter III, and any overage in Quarter II will be deducted from Quarter IV.

This action also specifies a new method for carrying-over <u>Loligo</u> squid quarterly underages for the 2002 fishing year. Currently, by default, quarterly underages carry over into Quarter IV because Quarter IV does not close until 95 percent of the total annual quota has been harvested. In the event that the first quarter landings for <u>Loligo</u> squid are less than 70 percent of the first quarter allocation, the underage below 70 percent would be applied to Quarter III. Underages from Quarters II and III would continue to be added to Quarter IV by default, based on the 95-percent closure rule mentioned above.
