## Small Entity Compliance Guide

Dear Monkfish Permit Holder:

This letter serves to inform you of the implementation of an emergency rule that temporarily amends the overfishing criteria in the Monkfish Fishery Management Plan (FMP), and suspends the Year 4 default management measures that took effect on May 1, 2002. In place of the Year 4 default measures, this emergency rule implements revised measures as follows:

- Specifies a target total allowable catch (TAC) of 19,595 metric tons (mt), with area-specific target TACs set at 11,674 mt and 7,921 mt for the Northern Fishery Management Area (NFMA) and Southern Fishery Management Area (SFMA), respectively;
- Allocates 40 monkfish days-at-sea (DAS) for monkfish limited access permit holders;
- Maintains the no monkfish trip limit in the NFMA for monkfish limited access vessels while fishing on a monkfish or Northeast multispecies DAS;
- Revises trip limits as specified below for monkfish limited access vessels fishing under a monkfish DAS in the SFMA; and
- Maintains all incidental catch limits at the same level as during the 2001 fishing year (May 1, 2001 April 30, 2002).

A summary of trip limits implemented by this emergency rule are provided in the following table.

Note: These measures are effective for 180 days from date of publication in the <u>Federal</u> <u>Register</u> but may be extended for an additional 180 days. If the emergency measures are extended, NMFS will notify you by means of another permit holder letter. Public comments are requested on this emergency rule, and must be received no later than 5 p.m. EDT June 14, 2002.
