SMALL ENTITY COMPLIANCE GUIDE

CONTROL DATE FOR THE ATLANTIC MACKEREL FISHERY

Dear Permit Holder:

This letter serves to inform you of action recently taken by the National Marine Fisheries Service on behalf of the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council (Council) relating to the development of a fishery management plan amendment for the Atlantic mackerel fishery.

The Council recently requested, and NMFS published, a control date for the Atlantic mackerel fishery. The publication of this notice of control date in the <u>Federal Register</u> serves to notify the public that a management system may be considered that would limit the number of participants in the fishery, and that eligibility criteria under such a system may include the control date. Entrants into this fishery after the control date will <u>not</u> be assured future access to this fishery if it is determined that a limited entry management system is needed to prevent overfishing. This notice is purely advisory.

The control date for Atlantic mackerel is: July 5, 2002
