Dear Permit Holder:

This letter is to inform you that the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) has approved final 2001 specifications for the summer flounder fishery. This rule will published on March 23, 2001 , and implements a total allowable landings (TAL) of 17.91 million lb (10.75 million lb commercial, 7.16 million lb recreational), consistent with the emergency action on August 2, 2000, taken to comply with a Court Order. The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission has adopted a higher TAL of 20.5 million lb (12.3 million lb commercial, 8.2 million lb recreational). However, the more restrictive TAL (17.91 million lb) implemented by this final rule will apply to all Federal permit holders, regardless of whether they fish in Federal or state waters.

Under the emergency regulations at $\$ 648.100(d)(2)$, any landings in excess of a state's commercial quota allocation in 2000 are to be deducted from that state's annual quota allocation for 2001 . In addition, any under-harvest of an individual state's summer flounder commercial quota in 2000 is to be added to that state's annual quota allocation for 2001.

The following table summarizes the initial and adjusted 2001 commercial summer flounder quotas, by state. These quotas are preliminary, and subject to change if additional 2000 landings data becomes available. All landings made since January 1, 2001 , count toward the state quotas.
