Subject: Interim Delegation of Authority for Collective Bargaining Agreements (CBAs)

The purpose of this interim delegation memorandum is to revise Paragraph 6.L(1)(g) of the current Reclamation Manual (RM) *Delegations of Authority* release. The current paragraph only addresses the authority to delegate wage supplements to CBAs. The revised language below will provide delegations for both non-wage and wage agreements.

With the issuance of this memorandum, the following interim delegation will be in effect until it is officially incorporated into the RM *Delegations of Authority* as Paragraph 6.L(1)(g):

(g) Collective Bargaining Agreements.

- (i) Non-wage. The Director, Policy and Administration is designated as Reclamation's administrative authority for oversight and review to determine compliance with non-wage collective bargaining agreements. Directors and regional directors are delegated the authority to approve non-wage supplements received from their respective Reclamation labor relations offices (370 DM 711.1.9). The authority of the Director, Policy and Administration, directors, and regional directors cannot be re-delegated.
- (ii) Wage. The Director, Policy and Administration is designated as Reelamation's administrative authority for oversight and review to determine compliance with wage supplements to basic collective hargaining agreements. Directors and regional directors are delegated the authority to approve wage supplements received from their respective Reelamation labor relations offices

(370 DM 711.1.9). The authority of the Director, Policy and Administration, directors, and regional directors cannot be re-delegated.

(iii) Negotiations. Directors and regional directors will delegate their authority, in a formal written document, to management representatives to enter into negotiations with unions. The authority of management representatives cannot be re-delegated.
