B1.3 Routine Maintenance

<u>Description of the Proposed Action</u>: BPA is proposing to repair approximately 22.4 miles of access roads within the Kalispell & Spokane Districts. Access road maintenance would include, but is not limited to, improving and constructing drain dips, water bars, rubber water flaps, landings, turn arounds, switchbacks, fords, and culverts within existing road prisms throughout the District. In addition, proposed road maintenance would also include: blading, shaping, grading, brushing, and spot and surface rock on existing road prisms to ensure safe access to structures. General equipment used for this type of road maintenance includes: graders, rollers, bull-dozers, brush hogs, excavators, and dump trucks.

<u>Findings</u>: In accordance with Section 1021.410(b) of the Department of Energy's (DOE) National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Regulations (57 FR 15144, Apr. 24, 1992, as amended at 61 FR 36221-36243, July 9, 1996; 61 FR 64608, Dec. 6, 1996, 76 FR 63764, Nov. 14, 2011), BPA has determined that the proposed action:

- (1) fits within a class of actions listed in Appendix B of 10 CFR 1021, Subpart D (see attached Environmental Checklist);
- (2) does not present any extraordinary circumstances that may affect the significance of the environmental effects of the proposal; and
- (3) has not been segmented to meet the definition of a categorical exclusion.

Based on these determinations, BPA finds that the proposed action is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
