Alternative Fuel Station Directions

As part of its partnership with Department of Energy, National Renewable Energy Laboratory and the Clean Cities program, a collaborative team worked with nps.gov staff to provide instructions to parks on how to add the Alternative Fueling Station Locator to their websites. Instructions were sent out in June 2013 through an update to the Content Management System points of contact. The goal of this initiative is to increase visitor awareness of alternative fuel resources near national parks and along travelling routes.

Several parks are already publicizing the Alternative Fueling Station Locator on their website including Canyonlands, Golden Gate and Yellowstone.



Join in and help visitors find alternative fuels! Add similar content to the Directions page of your park's website with a link to the Department of Energy's Alternative Fueling Station Locator at http://www.afdc.energy.gov/locator/stations. First, use the map to confirm that there are fueling stations nearby or along major routes used to access your park.
