Lewis and Clark Regional Water System -Water Treatment Plant

The Lewis and Clark Regional Water System, Water Treatment Plant received \$59.5 million in American Recovery and Reinvestment Act funding. This funding was combined with \$11.9 million in nonfederal funds to build a lime-softening conventional water treatment plant that processes 35 million gallons per day. It was put into service in 2012 and provided service to 12 of 25 connections.

The funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act accelerated completion of the project, serving people at an earlier date. Once completed, the Lewis and Clark Rural Water System will provide reliable drinking water supplies to about 300,000 people.

The Lewis and Clark Rural Water System is located in South Dakota, Minnesota and Iowa. The Water Treatment Plant assisted the Lewis and Clark Rural Water System meet a water service contract with Sioux Falls, Iowa.
