We are writing to support the reactivation of the sanctuary Site Evaluation List (SEL), which is a vital part of the process to create national marine sanctuaries. The SEL is an important process by which local communities can start a conversation with their communities about whether they support a national marine sanctuary off their coast. The SEL will open up a process for communities across the country, not just those near Monterey Bay National Marine Sanctuary, to engage in this process and make their voices known.

We believe that each community must decide for itself whether a national marine sanctuary is right for their area. But without the reactivation of the SEL, local communities' ability to engage in this process is limited.
