Dear Mr. Virden:

Thank you for the opportunity to review and comment on the Final Environmental Assessment (EA) and draft Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) to operate the Yuma Desalting Plant (YDP) as designed at a sufficient flow and appropriate duration to gather benchmark performance and cost data which can only be obtained through actual plant operations; determine whether any additional corrective actions to plant design or equipment would be necessary for long-term operation of the plant; and test changes and corrections (such as the fully-automated distributed control system) which have already been implemented at the YDP as part of maintaining its ready reserve status. The United States Section, International Boundary and Water Commission (USIBWC) is charged through various treaties and international agreements with evaluating the relationship of projects to international obligations of the United States. Please coordinate with the USIBWC during the planning stages for proposed work being conducted in Mexico. This includes, but is not limited to, sampling, surveys, collecting or obtaining natural resource materials.
