<p>Snyder: If we send someone to speak to a group, does Simonton have to approve it?</p>	<p>Simonton: We would approve a standard presentation for everyone to use when speaking.</p>
<p>Huber: A physical tour is better than a virtual tour. Could a control room be preserved to put in a museum? It would be a great thing to include. Can they save buildings like the mushroom building to use? One of the greatest things is the green space around the site. I do not see any plans to preserve a green space that could be set aside and have small parks.
