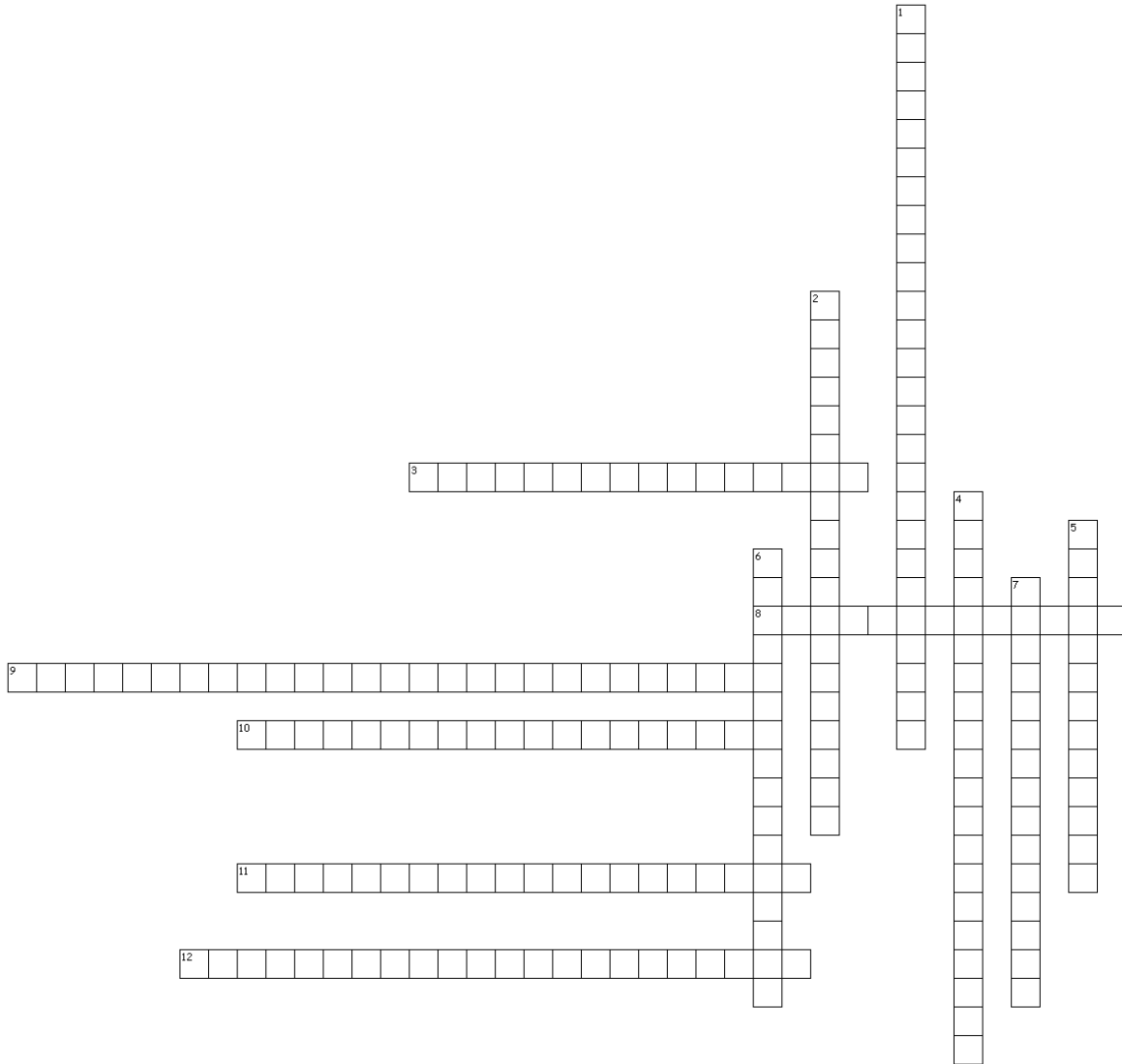


Critically Endangered Reptile and Amphibian Species

3. Originally found in the Nile Delta this species has a mating call that is thought to sound like the sound of a mourning dove's call.
8. This non-venomous snake is unique in that the male and females coloration are opposite on another.
9. This freshwater species spends nearly 95% of its life buried motionless in the sand.

10. This freshwater reptile suffers from a bad reputation in its native Philippines because of its association with another species of its kinda that is considered a "man-eater".

11. In its Central American homeland it is believed that once this amphibian dies it turns to gold, symbolizing good luck and good fortune.

12. This rare turtle can only be found on a small island in the Philippines.

1. This species is the only of its kind that has undergone no obvious changes since its ancestors were around during the time of the dinosaurs.

2. The males of this extremely rare Madagascar tortoise can be found using their signature shell to wrestle with one another for the attention of females.

4. This rare reptile can be recognized by its signature three or four yellow stripes.

5. The eggs of this species are considered to a royal delicacy in Cambodia.

6. This fierce reptile is thought to be extinct in the wild, except for in its native home of Cambodia.

7. In the subtropic rainforests of Colombia this frog species is being threatened by fungal infection.
