

DATA CENTER

The Better Buildings Initiative is a Presidential leadership initiative which calls on chief executive officers, university presidents, and state and local government leaders to motivate significant improvements in energy efficiency across the United States to create American jobs.

Data centers offer a tremendous opportunity for energy and cost savings. Organizations that own and or operate data centers can partner with DOE to lead by example in one of 2 ways:

- Better Buildings Challenge Partners commit to reduce the energy intensity of their portfolio (including data centers) by at least 20 percent within 10 years and share their results.
- Better Buildings Data Center Accelerator Partners commit to reduce the energy intensity of at least one data center by at least 25 percent within 5 years and share their results.

A Better Buildings Challenge Partner Agrees to:

✓ Commit

- Publicly pledge to improving the energy intensity of their entire portfolio, including data centers, by at least 20 percent within 10 years
- Assign a senior executive within 1 month to fulfill the Better Buildings Challenge commitments

✓ Take Action

- Develop an energy metering plan for their data centers and a schedule within 6 months to implement metering to measure energy savings progress toward goals
- ► Announce a showcase project within 9 months
- Announce the use of one or more energy efficiency implementation models within a year

✓ Report Results

- Share information on the energy efficiency implementation models used to achieve the energy savings pledge
- Make available portfolio-wide, building level energy performance information used to document progress toward achieving energy reduction goals on an annual basis. Partners are encouraged to submit data in 6 month intervals
- Provide regular updates on progress with annual information on energy savings across the organization and energy performance at the facility level as the basis for recognition

An Accelerator Partner Agrees to:

✓ Commit

- Assign a senior representative of the data center management team within 1 month to fulfill the Data Center Accelerator Partner commitments in the Better Buildings Program
- Publicly pledge to an improved efficiency goal of at least 25 percent in a one (or more) data centers (IT load > 100 kw) within 5 years

✓ Take Action

- Develop a baseline PUE measurement within 6 months
- Develop an energy metering plan and a schedule within 18 months to implement metering to measure energy savings progress toward goals

✓ Report Results

- Make facility-level energy performance data for metered facilities available within 12 months; flexibility provided for proprietary information
- Provide regular updates on progress with annual facility level energy performance information as the basis for recognition

✓ Assist

- Provide technical expertise and training to support measuring, tracking, and improving energy performance
- Provide a repository for relevant best practice and research documents
- Collaborate on a regular basis

✓ Connect

- Facilitate the sharing of best practices across the industry
- Create networking opportunities for data center owners and managers to share innovative solutions

✓ Recognize Success

- Feature partners who leverage, develop, and share innovative and cost-effective energy efficiency solutions
- Provide national recognition to Partners commensurate with energy results achieved
