The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issues this Determination of Corrective Action Complete Without Controls to the INMETCO facility in Ellwood City, PA (the Facility). EPA issues this Determination under the authority of the Solid Waste Disposal Act as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (RCRA) and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 (HSWA), 42 U.S.C. § 6901 *et seq.*, and EPA regulations at 40 C.F.R. Parts 260-271 and Part 124. This Determination reflects current EPA guidance titled *Final Guidance on Completion of Corrective Action at RCRA Facilities* (February 25, 2003).

EPA used the administrative procedures found in 40 CFR Part 270 to provide public notice and solicit comment on EPA's determination. The forty-five (45) day comment period ended on March 12, 2003. After consideration of all comments received, EPA's decision is substantially unchanged from the original proposed decision of no further action. The Determination is based on: (1) All closure and post-closure requirements applicable at the regulated units have been filled and (2) all corrective action obligations have been met. Therefore, EPA determined that no further correction action is necessary at the Facility. The INMETCO facility currently operates under the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) Permit for Hazardous Waste Treatment, Storage, and/or Disposal Facility program so a permit modification to reflect this Determination is not necessary.

This Determination completes the corrective action process under HSWA. The Facility must continue to comply with all applicable parts of RCRA.
