Proposed rule to designate critical habitat for *Consolea corallicola* (Florida semaphore cactus) and *Harrisia aboriginum* (aboriginal prickly-apple) January 2015

About the Document

Title: Proposed rule to designate critical habitat for *Consolea corallicola* (Florida semaphore cactus) and *Harrisia aboriginum* (aboriginal prickly-apple)

Purpose: The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service) has prepared a proposal to designate critical habitat for *Consolea corallicola* (Florida semaphore cactus) and *Harrisia aboriginum* (aboriginal prickly-apple), two plants endemic to South Florida, under the Endangered Species Act (Act). In total, approximately 4,411 acres (1,785 hectares) for *C. corallicola* in Miami-Dade and Monroe Counties, Florida; and 3,444 acres (1,394 hectares) for *H. aboriginum* in Manatee, Charlotte, Sarasota, and Lee Counties, Florida, fall within the boundaries of the proposed critical habitat designations. We listed *C. corallicola* and *H. aboriginum* as endangered species under the Act on October 24, 2013 (78 FR 63795).

About the Peer Review Process

Type of Review: Influential

Date of Peer Review: Peer review will occur between January 22, 2015, and March 23, 2015.

Estimated Dissemination Date of the Final Rulemaking Document: January 2016

Process: The Service will solicit written comments from three independent scientific reviewers. Formal request for peer review will be made by individual letters to experts from various backgrounds at several universities, institutions, and agencies. Reviewers were selected by the Service for their recognized expertise with South Florida

ecosystems, as well as general expertise with plant ecology and conservation. We are following our national policy on peer review and our regional approach for peer review for rulemakings. In selecting peer reviewers, we consider four key factors – expertise, balance, independence, and avoidance of conflict of interest.

This review will be occurring concurrently with the public comment period for the proposed action. The public comment period is now open and will close on March 23, 2015. The Service will use the information received from the peer review process, as appropriate, to develop the final critical habitat rules for the taxa indicated above.

The Service will provide each peer reviewer with information necessary to complete the peer review. We will request that reviewers use the Southeast Region's guidance to ensure that reviews comply with the 1994 policy statement for listing and critical habitat designation under the Act. Peer reviewers are expected to: review all material provided; identify, review, and provide other relevant data; and, provide written comments on relevance and soundness of data, analysis or assumptions of data, and whether we have used the best available science in making the proposed determinations. Peer review comments will be public documents.

About Public Participation

Public comments on the proposed critical habitat designation will be sought with proposed rules published in the *Federal Register* and by mail to interested parties, a press release of the availability of the proposals to interested parties, and a public hearing if requested. The Service will consider all comments received prior to publishing a final determination.

The Service published a notice in the *Federal Register* for the proposed designation of critical habitat for proposed listing of *Consolea corallicola* and *Harrisia aboriginum*. A summary of the results of the peer review will also be published with the final rule determinations in the Federal Register.

This peer review plan is made available on this website to allow the public to monitor our compliance with the Office of Management and Budget's Final Information Quality Bulletin for Peer Review.
