Subject: San Luis Reservoir Expansion Draft Appraisal Report

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

The Bureau of Reclamation has prepared a Draft Appraisal Report documenting our evaluation of conceptual alternative plans for increasing the storage capacity of San Luis Reservoir to improve the reliability of Central Valley Project (CVP) water deliveries. Reclamation is seeking comments on the Draft San Luis Reservoir Expansion Appraisal Report by January 17, 2014.

An expansion of the dam and reservoir would address at least four factors affecting the reliability of CVP deliveries associated with San Luis Reservoir. These factors include water quality in the reservoir, seismic risk to the dam, Delta conditions and regulations affecting the timing and volume of water available to store in the reservoir, and timing and volume of demand for water stored in the reservoir.

The Draft Appraisal Report includes recommendations to work with the California Department of Water Resources, Santa Clara Valley Water District, and the San Luis and Delta-Mendota Water Authority to reconsider the expansion of the dam and reservoir as an alternative to address the San Luis Low Point problem, the dam safety risks, and other factors affecting CVP water delivery reliability.
