Kongiganak Project

The community of Kongiganak was at risk of losing teacher housing, the raised wooden traffic path, and electrical lines, because of the eroding Kongnignanohk riverbank. The Natural Resources Conservation Service controlled the erosion, protecting the community. Through this project a good working relationship in the Alaska Native, off-road village of Kongiganak was developed.

The Natural Resources Conservation Service funded this project with \$4,190,000.
