SUBJECT: Omission of Language in Revisions to Test Methods, Performance Specifications, and Testing Regulations for Air Emission Sources Proposed Rule

### Background

On September 8, 2015, the EPA published the subject proposed rule in the Federal Register. It has been brought to our attention that part of four paragraphs from four different test methods were inadvertently proposed to be deleted.

The Federal Register Printing Office uses \*\*\* to indicate that the language within a paragraph will be retained and \*\*\*\*\* to indicate that the language following a paragraph will be retained. The \*\*\* do not appear at the end of the four paragraphs (cited below) in the proposed rule which would have indicated that the Agency was retaining the remainder of the four paragraphs.

### Clarification/Correction

The purpose of this memo is to make you aware that it was not the Agency's intent to delete the existing (prior to the subject proposal) sentences in the paragraphs cited below.

- Method 202, paragraph 8.5.4.3 (p. 54152)
- Method 1, paragraph 11.2.1.2 (p. 54157)
- Method 2, paragraph 6.7 (p. 54157)
- Method 30B, paragraph 8.3.3.8 (p. 54165)

The Agency will include the above paragraphs in their entirety (as opposed to using \*\*\*) in the final rule to avoid confusion.
