Ellen O'Donnell, a 7th and 8th grade science teacher at Deerfield Community School will depart on May 14 for a research mission at sea. Through the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Teacher at Sea program, O'Donnell will spend 12 days working on the ship, living the life of a field scientist.

The program provides kindergarten though college teachers the opportunity to work with scientists and crew to increase their level of environmental literacy by fostering an interdisciplinary research experience. O'Donn
