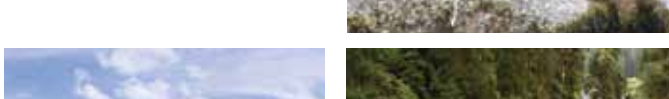

## State and Private Forestry

The Forest Service cooperates with State and local governments, forest industries, and other private landowners and forest users in the management, protection, and development of forest land in non-Federal ownership. State and Private Forestry offices are located in the Forest Service regional offices, except for the Eastern Region.

## International Forestry

Through its International Programs Staff in Washington, DC, the Forest Service plays a key role in formulating policy and coordinating U.S. support for the protection and sound management of the world's forest resources. It works closely with other U.S. agencies such as the Agency for International Development, the U.S. Department of State, and the Environmental Protection Agency, as well as with nonprofit development organizations, wildlife organizations, universities, and international assistance organizations. The Forest Service's international work has served to link people and communities striving to protect and manage forests throughout the world.
