## **Assistant Deputy Chief of Naval Operations Fleet Readiness and Logistics**

Mr. Ronald J. Davis, Jr is currently the senior civilian responsible for policy, program, resource allocation, and assessment of world-wide readiness requirements of Navy operating forces and their associated logistics and shore installations. Prior to this assignment, he was the Assistant Deputy Commandant, Installations and Logistics, Headquarters, U.S. Marine Corps, in Washington DC. He was assigned to this position from September 2010 to October 2013. He oversaw all Marine Corps logistics, installations, contracting policy, business process improvement and small business operations.

Over his 33 year career, Mr. Davis has held a wide variety of engineering, logistics and management positions across the Defense Department. From March 2004 to June 2004 he was the Acting Director, Supervisor of Shipbuilding Management Group (04Z), Headquarters, Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, DC. Mr. Davis was promoted to Senior Executive Service in June of 2004 as the Deputy G-3 for Industrial Operations, Headquarters, U.S. Army Materiel Command. His responsibilities included industrial operations, industrial base policy, partnerships with industry, and programs for continuous improvement including Lean Six Sigma. In November of 2005 Mr. Davis was promoted to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Business Transformation, G-7, Headquarters, U.S. Army Materiel Command. In October 2007 Mr. Davis' responsibilities were expanded as the G-4/7/9 to include AMC-wide facilities, environmental stewardship, and Base Realignment and Closure. In May 2010 his responsibilities were further expanded to include AMC-wide maintenance, reset, equipping, Army Force Generation and supply management.

Mr. Davis received a bachelor's of science degree in civil engineering from the Georgia Institute of Technology. He later entered graduate school at the Industrial College of the Armed Forces, National Defense University and was awarded a master's of science degree in national resource strategy.

While at the National Defense University he was honored as a Distinguished Academic Graduate (2003). Mr. Davis' other awards include the Meritorious Civilian Service Award (2010) and the General Brehon B. Somervell Medal of Excellence for Multifunctional Logisticians (2010).
