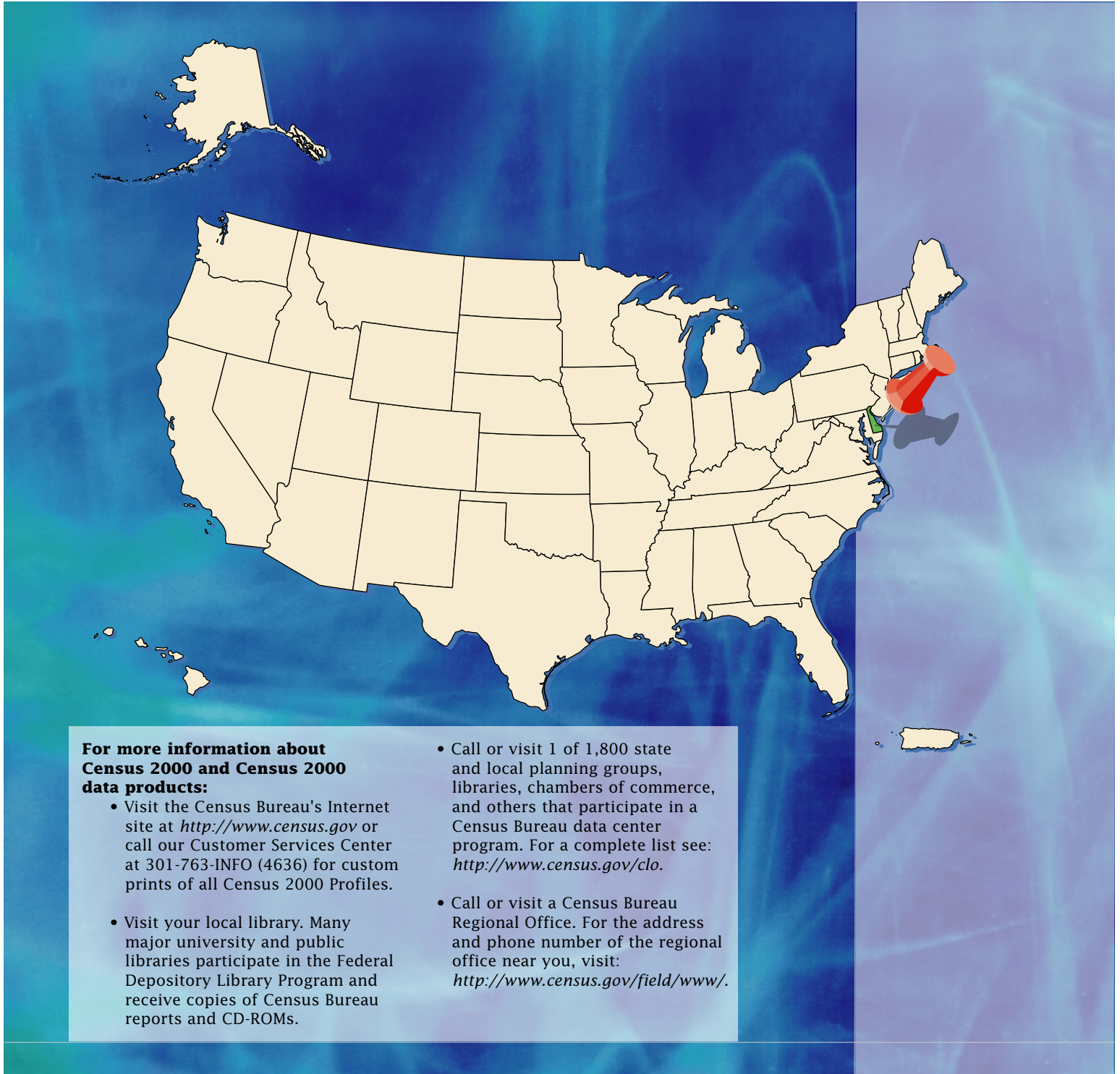

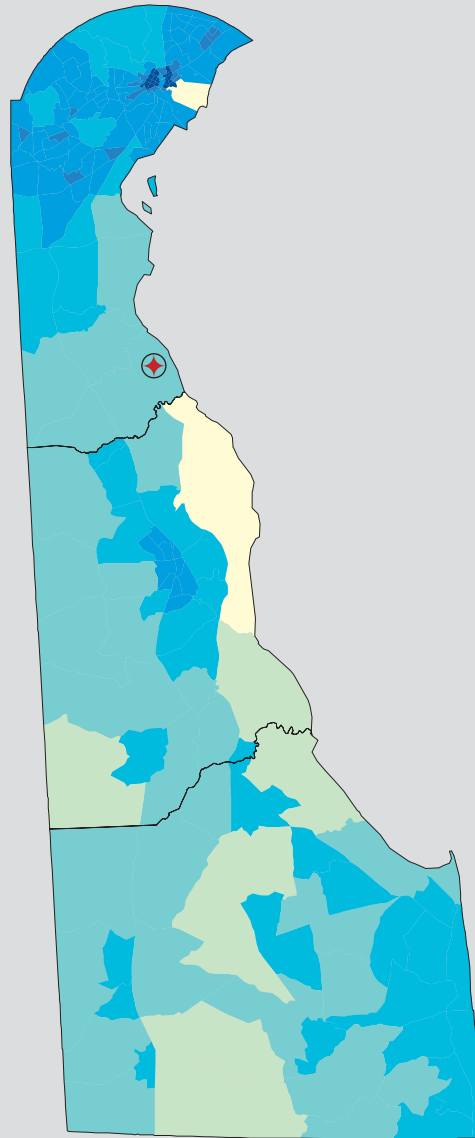

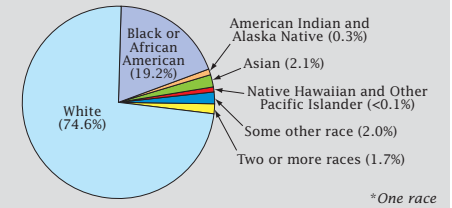
Population Density by Census Tract

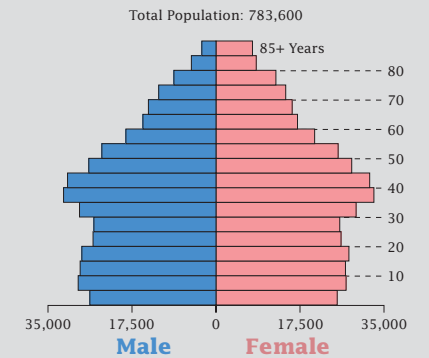
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State Race* Breakdown

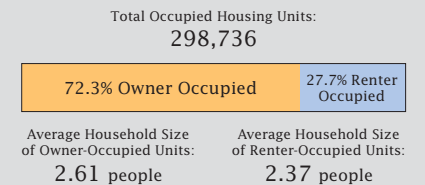


Hispanic or Latino (of any race) makes up **4.8%** of the state population.
