Where Cattle Outnumber People, The Odds are Good For Sage Grouse

n the largest county in Oregon, cattle outnumber people 14 to 1. Harney County's high-desert sagebrush landscape supports about 500 ranches and farms. Most of those landowners have worked with the Harney County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) at least once.

By working in close partnership with the USDA's Natural Resources Conservation Service-led Sage Grouse Initiative and other partners, the SWCD leverages diverse cost-share opportunities to help landowners conserve sagebrush range. "We're not talkers, we're doers," says district manager Marty Suter-Goold.

For instance, Harney County SWCD is the first SWCD in the nation to hold a programmatic Candidate Conservation Agreement with Assurances with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service for Greater sage-grouse. So far, 71 landowners have signed up with the SWCD to conserve 580,000 acres of sage grouse habitat under this agreement.

Plus, in 2014 the SWCD received a Regional Conservation Partnership Program award from the NRCS (shared with seven other counties with sage grouse in Oregon), which complements a host of state and federal programs aimed at conserving sagebrush country.

The SWCD is also adept at working across fence lines so that landscape-scale projects—like conifer removal or invasive grass treatments—span both private and public lands. Their recipe for collaborative conservation is improving the odds for both sage grouse and ranchers in southern Oregon.
