As you know, this week the Federal Leadership Committee for the Chesapeake Bay will release the FY 2011 Action Plan for Protecting and Restoring the Chesapeake Bay. The development and production of this first annual action plan is a significant accomplishment, thanks to you and your input and involvement in its preparation. The finishing touches are being applied now, and we will send the final version out to all of you as soon as possible. The official roll-out will occur this Thursday, September 30—on time! The report will be released through the Executive Order's public information website: www.executiveorder.chesapeakebay.net.

Earlier this month you received an email from Noel Jones requesting you "save the date" of Friday, October 8, for a NOAA Chesapeake Bay Executive Order Implementation Kick-Off event. Now that we have completed the action plan, it's time to start to shift focus to implementation. In addition, as Executive Order 13508 carries with it the annual requirement for an action plan, as well as a progress report, it is important to discuss how we can best track our progress ensure ongoing coordination. The first annual progress report will be based on the FY 2011 Action Plan and is anticipated to be released in January 2012.

We are hosting this NOAA kick-off event in Annapolis; attached here you will find a draft agenda. For those of you who are not in the greater DC-metro area, we will have a call-in line operating to facilitate your participation. The call-in number is 866-917-0618, and the passcode is 1613714. We will review the highlights and key messages associated with the FY 2011 Action Plan, and solicit your feedback regarding how we can best move our collective effort forward to meet the goals we have established for NOAA—both for FY 2011 and in the future. In addition, we have some time set aside to provide time to hear from our federal partners—I know many of you are interested in making those connections. Following some general introductions and discussion of shared priorities, we will host a social/happy hour where you will have the opportunity to make direct connections with our partners in the other agencies, as well as reconnect with NOAA colleagues.
