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<b>Purpose of Information System or IT Project</b>	The primary purpose for CPS is to track funding authorization and budget execution. Corporate Planning System (CPS) is a comprehensive strategic planning system to assist in EERE's need to aggregate project data across program offices. CPS utilizes a common management approach to conducting business, and reduces inefficiencies and costs associated with maintaining a multitude of separate and non-integrated systems. Additionally, CPS helps manage, monitor, and develop Congressional Budget Requests, spend plans, budgets, project data, and portfolio performance. It supports multi-year program planning, AOP development, and automated program guidance letter creation.

All information is voluntarily submitted by the individual.</p>

If yes, was the Privacy Order CRD or Privacy Act clauses included in their contracts?</p>	<p>Yes, contractors are involved with the maintenance of the system. All contractors are required to sign the HQ LAN Rules of Behavior. Affected contracts include the appropriate FAR privacy contract clauses.</p>

IMPACT ANALYSIS:</b></p> <p>How does this project or information system impact privacy?</p>	<p>The system contains personally identifiable information such as names, phone numbers, addresses and employment information of individuals. This information is low risk PII and the potential for privacy concerns if the system happened to be compromised is low.</p>
<p><b>5. SORNs</b></p> <p>How will the data be retrieved? Can PII be retrieved by an identifier (e.g. name, unique number or symbol)?</p> <p>If yes, explain, and list the identifiers that will be used to retrieve information on the individual.</p>	<p>The search function within CPS only provides the project roles and project information. Users cannot search through a unique identifier to produce individual's PII.</p>

With what other agencies or entities will an individual's information be shared?</b></p>	<p>CPS currently interconnects with database management systems to eliminate the need for duplicate data entry to bring information into a structure that enables enhanced headquarters use of data. Data is entered directly into the Project Management Information System (ProMIS) by National Energy Technology Laboratory (NETL), the Project Management Database (GFO-PMD) by Golden Field Office, Windows System Approach to Grants Administration (WinSAGA) and the Encore database.</p>

<p><b>14. What kinds of reports are produced about individuals or contain an individual's data?</b></p>	<p>CPS does not produce reports pertaining to individuals or individual's data.</p>
<p><b>15. What will be the use of these reports?</b></p>	<p>N/A, CPS does not produce reports pertaining to individuals or individual's data.</p>
<p><b>16. Who will have access to these reports?</b></p>	<p>N/A, CPS does not produce reports pertaining to individuals or individual's data.</p>

<p><b>17. Will this information system provide the capability to identify, locate, and monitor individuals?</b></p>	<p>The CPS system includes names, phone numbers, addresses and employment information. Therefore, if the system and/or data are compromised this information could be used to locate individuals</p>
<p><b>18. What kinds of information are collected as a function of the monitoring of individuals?</b></p>	<p>The CPS system does not have the capability to monitor individuals.</p>



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**19. Are controls implemented to prevent unauthorized monitoring of individuals?**

The CPS system has controls in place to prevent unauthorized monitoring of individuals.

### DATA MANAGEMENT & MAINTENANCE

**20. How will records about individuals be kept current and verified for accuracy, relevance and completeness? Include PII data collected from sources other than DOE records.**

All records are kept up to date and accurate through the Central Contract Registry. The information is updated when an individual's status has changed.

**21. If the information system is operated in more than one site, how will consistent use of the information be ensured at all sites?**

The system is only operated at one site, EERE Headquarters.

### Retention & Disposition

**22. What are the retention periods of data in the information system?**

All CPS information is backed up on a daily and weekly basis. Additionally, quarterly backups are performed with the backup tapes then being rotated off-site on a quarterly basis and archived indefinitely.

**23. What are the procedures for disposition of the data at the end of the retention period?**

The procedures around the disposition of data are documented in the Hard Disk Sanitization Procedures. The EERE Support Team uses BCWipe for sanitization of hard disks on systems that will either be transferred or retired.

### ACCESS, SAFEGUARDS & SECURITY

**24. What controls are in place to protect the data from unauthorized access, modification or use?**

The CPS system has controls in place to prevent unauthorized access, modification and use.

**25. Who will have access to PII data?**

Any user with a CPS account can access the PII data.





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<p><b>26. How is access to PII data determined?</b></p>	<p>For new access, an access request form is completed by the user and sent to the CPS Support Desk. The CPS administrator reviews the access request form and inquires with the user's program manager to determine if access request and roles are appropriate. Once approved, the CPS Support Team creates an account with the approved roles. If super-admin level access is requested, only the existing super-administrator can grant that level access. CPS user accounts are created through the web-based system and approved user privileges are role based. CPS Support Team grant permissions and access that is commensurate with the employee's job description, roles and responsibilities</p> <p>Audit trails are maintained for account creation, modification, disabling and termination.</p>
<p><b>27. Do other information systems share data or have access to the data in the system? If yes, explain.</b></p>	<p>CPS has interconnections with NETL's Project Management Information System (ProMIS), Golden Field Office's Project Management Database (GFO-PMD), and Windows System Approach to Grants Administration (WinSAGA), and the Encore database.</p> <p>These connections are all one way data paths. CPS pulls updated project information from them but does not transmit any CPS data back to them.</p>
<p><b>28. For connecting information systems, is there an Interconnection Security Agreement (ISA) or other agreement between System Owners to ensure the privacy of individuals is protected?</b></p>	<p>Currently there is an Interconnection Security Agreement (ISA) in place for the GFO-PMD and Encore interconnections, respectively, which is used to ensure the privacy of individuals is protected. However, ISAs for ProMIS and WinSAGA are not in place.</p>
<p><b>29. Who is responsible for ensuring the authorized use of personal information?</b></p>	<p>System Owner</p> <p>Cyber Security Program Manager</p>
