

Willow Beach National Fish Hatchery February 2015 Monthly Report



No fish were stocked this month.

173 visitors signed the guest registry in February.

The hatchery received 6,068 razorback larvae this month from collection efforts



on Lake Mohave by BOR, FWS, NPS and Marsh & Associates.

Hatchery staff continued installing flooring in the feed room. The project was completed this month.

Razorback systems were pressure washed and prepared for redistribution of fish on station.

An a/c unit was installed in the feed room. The old fan coil units that utilized river water for cooling were rusting out



and costing more than a/c over time. In addition, when the fan coil units leaked it damaged

other parts of the building. We are ready for trout feed now.

New bird netting was installed after the well development contract was complete.



Hatchery staff installed piping for oxygen delivery from the oxygen generator to the LHO boxes in each razorback rearing systems.

Achii Hanyo Native Fish Rearing Facility

In February 2015 at Achii Hanyo Native Fish Facility we got caught up on repairs. Multiple broken water pipes were repaired and one of the drain

systems was replaced. In addition, the dry ponds were prepared for



the arrival of this year's bonytail and razorbacks. The repairs included disking, grading, packing and levy repair.

Achii Hanyo received 3,993 razorbacks from WBNFH on February 26th that we will be grown for release in December.



Upcoming Events Achii will be receiving bonytail from SW

Native Aquatic Resources & Recovery Center (SNARRC) in the middle of March.

WBNFH will be reconfiguring razorback systems and adding LHO boxes.

Relict leopard frog tadpoles will be delivered to the hatchery in the next month.
