Maintain or increase litter cover Promote plant productivity Encourage diverse species Encourage plants with high root biomass Reduce bare areas Reduce surface disturbance Minimize grazing and traffic on wet soil Prescribe burn to reduce fuel build-up Assess soil quality and vegetation for early indications of undesirable changes
