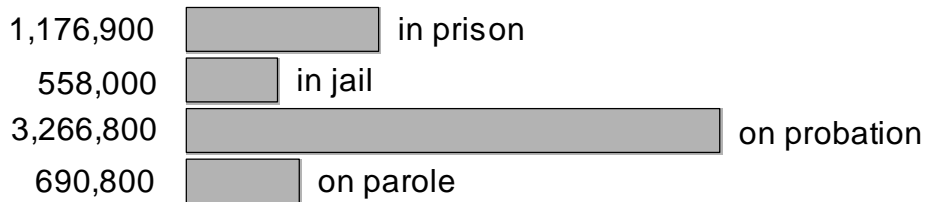




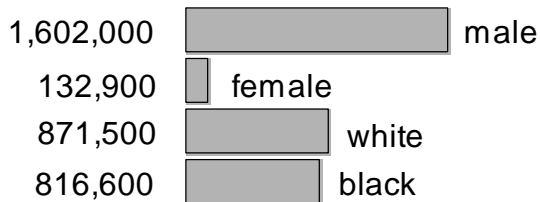

Correctional Populations in the United States, 1997

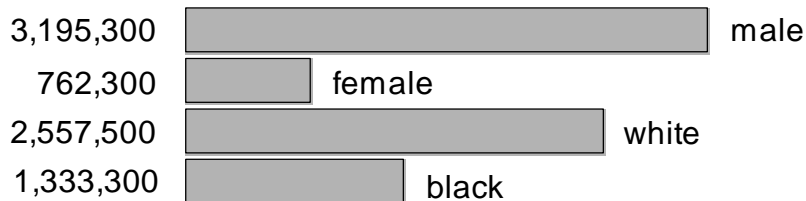
5.7 million adults in the United States were under correctional supervision in 1997

Because many jurisdictions update their population counts, the January 1, 1997, numbers may differ from those previously published for December 31, 1996.

Federal

Data for the Federal system are from the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts as provided to the BJS Federal Justice Statistics Program. Parole includes supervised release, parole, military parole, special parole, and mandatory release. Definitional differences exist between parole reported here and in other BJS data series.

The electronic monitoring count includes intensive supervision parolees (table 6.9).

Alabama
