U.S. gasoline prices decrease (long version)

The U.S. average retail price for regular gasoline fell to \$2.45 a gallon on Monday. That's down 9-tenths of a penny from a week ago, based on the weekly price survey by the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Pump prices were highest in the West Coast states at \$3 a gallon, down 4.7 cents from a week ago. Prices were lowest in the Gulf Coast states at 2.19 a gallon, down 4-tenths of a penny.
