U.S. gasoline prices decrease across the U.S. except for the west coast region (long version)

The U.S. average retail price for regular gasoline fell to \$3.55 a gallon on Monday. That's down 4 cents from a week ago, based on the weekly price survey by the U.S. Energy Information Administration.

Pump prices were highest in the West Coast region at 3.90 a gallon, up 10.3 cents from a week ago marking the highest weekly increase in this region since May. Prices were lowest in the Gulf Coast States at 3.30 a gallon, down 7.6 cents.
