Each year the Minerals Management Service (MMS) offers a variety of oil and gas reporter training seminars. The enclosed schedule lists the seminars planned through June 1999. They cover topics related to the following areas:

• Report of Sales and Royalty Remittance (Form MMS-2014)

How to prepare the Payor Information Form and the Form MMS-2014; how to make adjustments to previously reported data; billing functions; product valuation issues; electronic commerce; and the process of comparing reported sales data in MMS's Auditing and Financial System (AFS) with production data in our Production Accounting and Auditing System (PAAS).

Monthly Report of Operations (Form MMS-3160) and/or Oil and Gas Operations Report-OGOR (Form MMS-4054) and related Forms

How to prepare the forms; how to amend previously submitted data; well confirmation report; missing reports; electronic commerce; and the process of comparing reported sales data in MMS's Auditing and Financial System (AFS) with production data in our Production Accounting and Auditing System (PAAS).

In addition to the topics above, we will present brief overviews of our re-engineering efforts in each session. These overviews will explain proposed changes to reporting.

You do not need to take any action at this time. We will send you an invitation to each training seminar in your area about 6 weeks before the scheduled training date. At that time, we will notify you on how to register. You may attend all or some of the sessions. Except for your own travel and related expenses, this training is provided to you at no charge.

These seminars do not cover topics related to solid minerals. Please call 1-888-201-6416 for information.

We believe this training is a good investment of time and effort for both you and MMS. Proper reporting enables us to disburse revenues to the States and Indians in a timely manner. It allows you to reduce costly follow-up efforts and lessens the possibility of assessment actions. This is your opportunity to gain information from MMS personnel on various topics and to work together with us toward common goals of timely, accurate reporting.

Minerals Management Service Oil and Gas Payor Training Seminar Report of Sales and Royalty Remittance (Form MMS-2014)

Session title	Description
Establishing Your Database	Explains how to prepare the Payor Information Form (PIF) that MMS uses to establish your company as a payor in our computer system. Explains revenue sources and their importance in proper reporting.
Basic Reporting Principles and Form Preparation	Explains how and when to report and pay royalties, including who reports and pays, payment requirements, due dates, and report acceptance. Explains each section of the Form MMS-2014.
Commonly Used Transaction Codes	Explains the coding and specific reporting requirements for royalty due, royalty-in-kind, rent, minimum royalty, and estimated royalty payments.
Adjustments, Recoupments, and Refunds	Explains how to report adjustments, recoup overpaid Federal royalties, and establish a balance to recoup Indian, tribal, and allotted overpayments.
Billings and Appeals	Explains each type of bill (for example, ABIL, CBIL, IBIL, GBIL, TBIL) MMS generates and conditions that create them. Includes a discussion of when to report interest calculations on the Form MMS-2014 and what to do with negative interest statements. Explains the appeals process.
AFS/PAAS Comparison	Explains how exceptions are generated when there is a discrepancy between the sales/transfer volumes reported by the operator on the production report (to the Production Accounting and Auditing System [PAAS]) and the sales quantity reported by the payor on the royalty report (to the Auditing and Financial System [AFS]).
Product Valuation	Gives an overview of MMS's method of determining product value with emphasis on commonly encountered valuation issues. Discusses basic allowance regulations and exceptions under the regulations. (This session does not explain how to prepare allowance forms).
Electronic Commerce	Presents the various options and benefits for electronic reporting.
Re-Engineering	Explains RMP's review of existing Form MMS-2014 data. Discussion on the proposed modifications to the Form MMS-2014.

Overview	Explains the MMS organization; the Production Accounting and Auditing System (PAAS) and MMS and surface management agency responsibilities.
Reporting Principles	Explains who must report, when to report, where to report, and production reporting methods including what reports, authorized reporting formats, mailing addresses, due dates, editing, and report acceptance.
Reference Data Information	Explains how to use the appendices for assigned numbers and codes of MMS's PAAS Reporter Handbook—Lease, Facility Measurement Point, and Gas Plant Operators. Explains how and why MMS' RMP and Offshore Minerals Management (OMM) Programs work together and exchange data to process your reports. Explains how to interpret the confirmation reports you receive from MMS for your Well Information Forms (WELL) and Facility and Measurement Information Forms (FMIF).
OGOR Preparation/ Amended Reporting	Explains how to prepare and submit both original and amended OGORs. Includes ideas on where and how to save time on report preparation.
Other PAAS Reports	Explains when and how to prepare the Production Allocation Schedule Report (PASR), which MMS uses to verify certain data on the OGOR.
Overview of Missing Reports	Explains missing exception processing for production reports.
AFS/PAAS Comparison	Explains how exceptions are generated when there is a discrepancy between the sales/transfer volumes reported by the operator on the production report (to PAAS) and the sales quantity reported by the payor on the royalty report (to the Auditing and Financial System [AFS]).

Re-Engineering	Explains RMP's review of existing OGOR data. Discussion on the proposed modifications to the OGOR.
