	In recent months, SEARCH staff has been monitoring the activities of the ULC's Criminal Records Accuracy (CRA) Committee. ULC members must be lawyers, and each state has an appointment process to select Commissioners. The CRA Committee is creating model legislation to be presented to State Legislatures for adoption throughout the country. If enacted, the model legislation (as currently drafted) could have a significant impact on state criminal history repository operations, as it would significantly alter how criminal histories are compiled, maintained, and disseminated for non-criminal justice purposes.
