9 10	§24301.1 Purpose and Applicability		
11	(a) The purpose of this Chapter is to establish the minimum standards to properly		
12	implement and administer Guam's Recycling Revolving Fund in accordance with Title 10 of		
13	the Guam Code Annotated (GCA), Chapter 51, Article 3, §51307(c).		
14			
15	(b) These rules and regulations apply solely to recycling companies who meet the eligibility		
16	requirements delineated in §24305 of this Chapter.		
17			
18	§24301.2 Definitions.		
19	For the purposes of this Article, except as otherwise provided, the following words and phrases		
20	together with all of the common derivations thereof, shall have the meaning ascribed to them		
21	as follows:		
22			
23	(a) "Administrator" shall mean the Administrator of the Guam Environmenta		
24	Protection Agency (GEPA), or his or her designee.		
25			
26	(b) "Agency" shall mean the Guam Environmental Protection Agency

- (c) "Beneficial Use" shall mean the substitution of materials, either as generated or following additional processing, for some or all of the virgin materials in a natural or commercial product in a way that: provides a functional benefit; meets product specifications; and does not pose concerns to human health or the environment.
- - "Board" shall mean the Board of Directors of the Guam Environmental (d) Protection Agency.
- "Electronic Waste" or "E-Waste" shall mean electrical and electronic equipment (e) that is dependent on electric currents or electromagnetic fields in order to function (including all components, subassemblies and consumables which are part of the original equipment at the time of discarding). For example e-waste may include consumer/entertainment electronics such as televisions, DVD players and tuners; Devices of office, information and communications technology such as computers, circuit boards, telephones and mobile phones.

"Enameled White Goods" or "White Goods" shall mean appliances, with or without enamel, for home or commercial use including, but not limited to refrigerators, water heaters, air conditioners, washers, dryers and stoves.

(g) "GEPA" or "Guam EPA" shall mean the Guam Environmental Protection Agency.

2 (h) "Heavy Equipment" shall mean any equipment, motor vehicle or motor carrier, 3 or non-road motor vehicle with a gross weight or gross vehicle weight of five (5) 4 tons or more.

(i) "Import" shall mean to bring in, or accept delivery of recyclable materials from any source outside of Guam.

(j) "Junk Vehicle" means a motor vehicle, regardless of operating condition, that the registered owner has declared to have no value or no use, or that is abandoned by being placed, discarded, or disposed of on public or private property without approval by owners of said property for more than seven (7) calendar days, or that is no longer registered in accordance with Chapter 7 of Title 16 GCA.

(k) "Motor Vehicle" or "Motorized Vehicle" shall mean automobiles, automobile truck, automobile wagon, buses, trucks, motorcycles or other self-propelled wheeled conveyance that will be primarily for use on Guam's public streets, roads, and highways that are required to be registered with the Motor Vehicles Division, Department of Revenue and Taxation, Government of Guam.

(l) "Municipal Solid Waste" is a subset of solid waste and is defined as durable goods (e.g., appliances, batteries, tires), nondurable goods (e.g., newspapers, books, magazines), containers and packaging, food wastes, yard trimmings, and miscellaneous organic wastes from residential, commercial and industrial non-process sources.

2	(m)	"Person" shall mean any individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm,
3		company, corporation, association, joint stock company, trust, estate, or any
4		agency, department, or instrumentality of the Federal or local government, or
5		any other legal representatives, agents or assigns.
6		
7	(n)	"Recovered Resources" shall mean material or solid waste that has been
8		diverted from disposal for the purpose of recycling, composting or mulching.
9		This term does not include incineration or those materials that are generated and
10		normally reused on-site for manufacturing purposes.
11		
12	(o)	"Recyclable Materials" means materials that still have useful physical or
13		chemical properties after serving a specific purpose for the same or other
14		purpose. Recyclable materials include the following:
15		
16		(1) Batteries (i.e., lead-acid, portable computer batteries, nickel-
17		cadmium, sealed types for power backup);
18		(2) Automobiles, buses, and trucks or any form or any form of
19		motorized vehicle;
20		(3) Tires (passenger/commercial);
21		(4) Enameled white goods;
22		(5) Home appliances (other small appliances that are not considered
23		enameled white goods);
24		(6) Glass and plastic bottles;
25		(7) Foam padding;
26		(8) Lead;
27		(9) Metals (ferrous/non-ferrous);

2		(10)	Organic materials (i.e., tree trimmings, palm fronds, grass, food
3			waste, soiled cardboard);
4		(11)	Paper products;
5		(12)	Wood pallets and scrap wood;
6		(13)	Construction and demolition debris ('C&D');
7		(14)	X-ray film;
8		(15)	Automobile vehicle oil and fluids;
9		(16)	Freon and other refrigerant gases;
10		(17)	Electronic waste (i.e., computers, circuit boards, televisions, and
11			portable phones);
12		(18)	Heavy equipment; and
13		(19)	Other recyclable materials deemed recyclable by GEPA pursuant to
14			it Rules and Regulations.
15			
16	(p)	"Recycle"	or "Recycling" means the method by which recovered resources are
17		converted f	or use as raw materials or feedstock to make new products as defined
18		in §51102 (i	i) of Chapter 51 of Title 10 GCA.
19			
20	(q)	"Recycling	Company" shall mean any business licensed by the Department of
21		Revenue ar	nd Taxation, and issued a solid waste management permit from the
22		Guam Env	ironmental Protection Agency to conduct business on Guam, as
23		required in	Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 51, §51104.
24			
25	(r)	"Recycling	Industry Economic Stimulus Program" shall mean Public 33-136,
26		which is co	dified under Title 10 of the Guam Code Annotated, Article 3, Chapter

51, §51308.

27

(s)	"Recycling Facility" shall mean all contiguous land, structures, and other
	appurtenances, and improvements on the land used for the collection,
	separation, recovery, and sale or reuse of recovered resources that would
	otherwise be disposed of as municipal solid waste, and is an integral part of a
	manufacturing process aimed at producing a marketable product made of post
	consumer material.

(t) "Recycling Fee" shall mean an annual fee levied upon the registered owner of a motor vehicle to assist in the recycling and disposal of recyclable materials in accordance with this Article.

(u) "Solid Waste Management Facility" means any facility, or any machinery, equipment, vehicles, structures or any part of accessories thereof installed or acquired for the primary purpose of: collection, transportation, storage, recycling, processing or disposal of solid waste, and shall include sanitary landfills or resource recovery facilities.

(v) "Stimulus Certification Form" shall mean a form officially issued by Guam EPA as part of the Recycling Industry Economic Stimulus Program. The Form is to be completed by the eligible Recycling Facility to disclose and certify the types and quantities of recyclable materials shipped off-island to a recycling facility.

(w) "Sustainable Materials Management" means a systemic approach to using and reusing materials more productively over their entire lifecycles.

(x) "Zero Waste" means a holistic approach to addressing the problem of unsustainable resource flows. Zero Waste encompasses waste eliminated at the

1		source through product design and producer responsibility, and waste reduction
2		strategies further down the supply chain such as recycling, reuse and
3		composting.

5	SEC	ΓΙΟΝ 24302. RECYCLING REVOLVING FUND
6		
7	(a)	There is hereby established a Recycling Revolving Fund, hereinafter referred as "Fund",
8		as established under Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 51, §51302.
9	(b)	All revenues generated from the collection of the "recycling fees", as authorized in
10		accordance with Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 51, §51305, including interest
11		earned, shall be deposited into the <i>Fund</i> .
12	(c)	The Fund shall be a non-lapsing, revolving fund, and maintained separate and apart
13		from any other funds of the government of Guam.
14	(d)	All recycling fees, reimbursements, assessments, forfeitures and other funds collected or
15		received pursuant to this Chapter shall be deposited in the Fund, and shall not lapse at
16		the end of the fiscal year, but shall roll over into the next fiscal year or until expended.

18	§2430	2.1 Administration of Recycling Revolving Fund
19	(a)	Monies in the <i>Fund</i> shall be administered, managed, and maintained by the GEPA
20	(u)	Administrator, or his designee, for the implementation of this Chapter.

22	(b)	Monies in the <i>Fund</i> shall be expended and/or encumbered to fund solid waste reduction,
23		reuse, recycling-related and green purchasing activities and operations, inclusive, but

not limited to, the following:

1	1) Continuation of the Recycling Industry Economic Stimulus Program in
2	accordance with §24305;
3	2) Guam's Zero Waste Plan (2013) implementation;
4	3) Public outreach education, inclusive of trainings and workshops;
5	4) Program management, development and capacity building; and
6	5) Grants for schools, colleges and universities, businesses, government and
7	non-governmental organizations for zero waste or recycling pilot projects.
8 9	(c) The Administrator shall administer the Fund in accordance with this Chapter to cause
10	the following material/waste to be recycled according to the following priority:

12	1. First Priority: junk vehicles, tires, batteries, waste oil, white
13	goods/appliances,
14	2. Second Priority: paper, cardboard, plastic and glass
15	3. Third Priority: other recyclables as determined by the Administrator
16	(d) In a condense with Title 10 Cream Code Americand Chapter 51 C51202 CONITINI UNIC
17	(d) In accordance with Title 10 Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 51, §51303. CONTINUING
18	APPROPRIATION, as amended by Public Law 33-136, revenues from the Fund are
19	appropriated to the Guam Environmental Protection Agency to fund the following:
20	1) The Recycling Industry Economic Stimulus Program
21	2) The Administrator, no later than 10 calendar days after the end of each fiscal
22	year, shall transfer from the Recycling Revolving Fund, three percent (3%) of
23	the total amount collected during that fiscal year to fund one (1) FTE employee
24	at the Guam Environmental Protection Agency, Solid Waste Management
25	Program, to administer 10 GCA, Chapter 51, Article 3.
26	3) Three-hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) annually for Guam EPA to contract
27	the professional and technical services of a private company in accordance with

1	5 GCA Chapter 5, to further develop and implement the priorities delineated in
2	the Guam Zero Waste Plan (2013).
3	4) One-hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) annually for Guam EPA to contract
4	the professional services of a private company, in accordance with 5 GCA
5	Chapter 5, to conduct outreach and education, trainings and workshops, and
6	any activities that promote Zero Waste Plan implementation and recycling.
7	
8	SECTION 24303. LEVY AND COLLECTION OF RECYCLING FEES
9	(a) The Director of Revenue and Taxation is authorized to levy a Recycling Fee on
10	individuals who are renewing their annual motor vehicle registration with the
11	Department of Revenue and Taxation Division of Motor Vehicles the vehicle
12	registration system.
13	(b) The Director of Revenue and Taxation shall collect the Recycling Fees mandated and
14	transmit the fees for deposit in the Recycling Revolving Fund.
15	
16 17	§24303.1. Schedule of Recycling Fees
18	(a) The following recycling fees are hereby authorized in accessed on motor vehicles
19	imported into Guam:
20	
21	(1) Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) for each automobile, bus, and truck;
22	(2) Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each motorcycle and trailer;
23	(3) Thirty Dollars (\$30.00) for each piece of heavy equipment.
24	
25	(b) The Recycling Fee in §24303.1(a)(1) shall be waived upon initial issuance and
26	subsequent renewal of vehicle of license and registration for any Veteran determined by the
27	U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs (USDVA) to be 100% disabled or Individually

Unemployable due to military service connected injuries. The fee shall be waived for one (1)

28

- 1 non-commercial passenger vehicle, which includes sedans, coupes, pick-up trucks,
- 2 motorcycles and station wagons manufactured primarily for the purpose of carrying
- 3 passengers and including those passenger cars pulling other light trailers, registered to the
- 4 veteran, or legal guardian applying for benefits under this Section. A document issued by the
- 5 USDVA or a U.S. military ID card which certifies the disability rating, must be furnished to
- 6 the Department of Revenue and Taxation in order to waive the annual Recycling Fee.

## 8 §24303.2. Adjustment of Recycling Fees

- 9 The Guam Environmental Protection Agency Board of Directors shall review the fee
- authorized by §51506, supra, every four (24) months and is authorized to adjust the fee by not
- 11 more than twenty fee percent (25%) in accordance with Administrative Adjudication Law.

a) The Mayor's Council of Guam, in accordance with the applicable procurement laws and with the approval of the Administrator, is authorized to enter into contracts with recycling companies for the collection, recycling, disposal and processing, or any combination thereof, of automobiles, buses, heavy equipment, trucks, batteries, tires, white goods and other recyclable materials, and as required by or in accordance with, Article 3 and 4 of Title 10 GCA, Chapter 51.

b) The Mayor's Council of Guam shall require that all offerors include, as part of written offers, proof of current approved permits, including solid waste facility permits, and must be in compliance with all solid waste rules and regulations.

2	SECTIO	N 24305. RECYCLING INDUSTRY ECONOMIC STIMULUS PROGRAM
4	§24305.1.	Applicability and Eligibility
5	(a)	This Program is applicable solely to recycling companies licensed by the
6		Department of Revenue and Taxation to conduct business on Guam.
7	(b)	This Program applies to recyclable materials <u>solely generated on Guam</u> . Recyclable
8		materials imported into Guam for purposes such as, but not limited to, transit or
9		consolidation shall <b>not</b> qualify under this Program.
10	(c)	Recycling companies eligible to participate in this Program must meet <u>all</u> of the
11		following criteria:
12		1. Possess a valid Guam business license; and
13		2. Possess a valid solid waste management facility permit for processing and
14		storage from Guam Environmental Protection Agency of Guam; and
15		3. Report recycling data to GEPA annually as required under the facility's
16		solid waste management facility; and
17		4. Provide an official Bill of Lading or similar documentation detailing the
18		types of recyclable materials, their quantity in tons and the name of the
19		receiving facility; and
20		5. Completion and submittal of the <i>Stimulus Certification Form</i> provided by
21		Guam EPA; and
22		6. Remain in compliance with all solid waste rules and regulations.

24 25	§24305.2. (a)	Economic Stimulus and Sustainability Recycling Adjustment Plan  Recycling companies who meet all the eligibility requirements specified in this
26	( <i>a</i> )	Section will receive an economic stimulus of no more than thirty dollars (\$30,00) for

each ton of recyclable material transported off Guam to a recycling facility. Based on the availability of funds and funding priorities, some eligible submittals may receive no or partial stimulus payments.

- (b) The Guam Environmental Protection Agency shall develop a reasonable and practical Sustainable Recycling Adjustment Plan with a sliding scale that establishes the amount of economic stimulus per recyclable material identified under \$24302.1(c) to be disbursed to eligible recycling facilities on Guam participating in the Recycling Industry Economic Stimulus Program.
- (c) The Sustainable Recycling Adjustment Plan shall be evaluated annually and take into consideration economic parameters, such as, but not limited to, recyclable material commodity prices and shipping costs.
