SUBJECT: Class Deviation - Extension of 8(a) Partnership Agreement Between the U.S. Small Business Administration and the Department of Defense

My October 2, 2006 memo, Class Deviation 2006-O0002, provided notice of an extension through December 1, 2006, of the 8(a) Partnership Agreement between the Small Business Administration and the Department of Defense (DoD).
