Using $GoogleEarth_{TM}$ on your Smartphone to Access Soil Survey

Access USDA National Cooperative Soil Survey data by using Google $\mathsf{Earth}_{\mathsf{TM}}$ on your smartphone.

- Google Earth_™ allows you to quickly and efficiently view soil maps for specific locations
- It also lets you zoom in on a specific GPS location

Using Google Earth_™

- 1. Make sure you have both the Google Earth_{TM} and Google Drive_{TM} applications installed on your smartphone.
- 2. Open the browser on your phone (or use Google Apps) and navigate to

http://casoilresource.lawr.ucdavis.edu/soil_web/kml/SoilWeb.kmz or just search for SoilWeb.kmz.

- 3. Download the file called "SoilWeb.kmz" by clicking it.
- 4. Select "Open in..." in the top left-hand corner and click "Open in Google Drive" on the next window.
- 5. Google Drive_™ will ask you whether you would like to upload the file to Google Drive_™. When prompted, click "Upload".
- 6. You should see the SoilWeb file in your Google $Drive_{TM}$ under "My Drive".
- 7. When you click on the SoilWeb file, Google Drive_™ will tell you it is "Unable to open file." Tap the arrow icon at the top right of the screen and under "Actions", tap "Open In...".
- 8. Open the SoilWeb file in Google $Earth_{TM}$.
- 9. You should now see the soil map with different delineations loaded in Google Earth_ ${\mbox{\tiny TM}}$!
- 10. For more information on a specific soil type, tap the soil map unit.



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
