700 - 1,000 new neural connections form every second

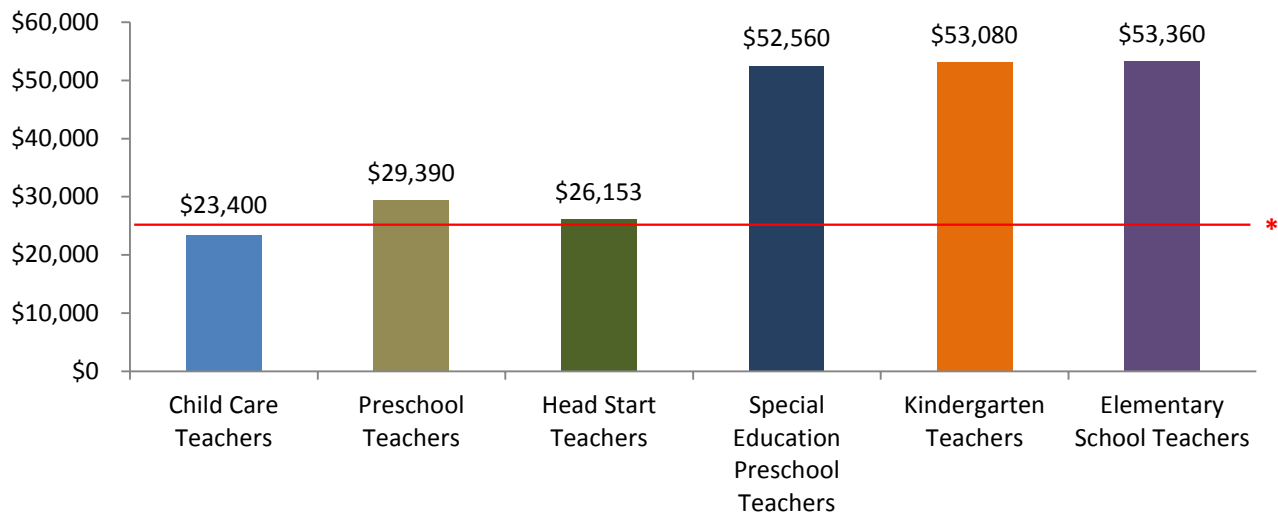
Genetics plus experiences shape the developing brain

- 17.4%** Children Under Age 5 Living in Poverty
