This memorandum identifies enhancements, both ongoing and planned, that will broaden the scope of the Defense Procurement and Acquisition Policy strategic sourcing website at http://www.acq.osd.mil/dpap/ss/index.html. Added website features include:

- A taxonomy section, organizing DoD spend to enable portfolio management, spend analysis, and the establishment of baselines for measuring progress.
- A spend analysis section, identifying spend patterns and buying practices of services, supplies, and equipment from both the requiring office and contracting office perspectives.
- A section entitled, "Learn about Strategic Sourcing," identifying the DoD strategic sourcing framework and key doctrines of strategic sourcing.
- A section entitled, "What Is the DoD-Wide Strategic Sourcing (DWSS) Program?"
 explaining how the DWSS Program helps DoD achieve "Better Buying Power"
 mandates and improve acquisition efficiencies with a comprehensive application of
 strategic sourcing processes to achieve increased effectiveness and reduced costs.

The website also offers links to related resources, such as:

- The Departments of Navy's and Air Force's strategic sourcing websites;
- The Defense Acquisition University's Better Buying Power Gateway;
- Strategic-sourcing and spend-analysis-strategies Continuous Learning Modules; and
- DoD policy memoranda.

In the coming weeks, additional features will link to efficiencies and strategic sourcing successes, such as:

- DoD-wide business arrangements, solutions, and initiatives;
- Strategic sourcing reports and briefings, including Acquisition Statistics (AcqStat) reports to the Office of Management and Budget;
- Strategic Sourcing Director's Board (SSDB) agendas, minutes, and briefings;
- Lessons learned and best practices.
