The Census Bureau has designated (123) libraries throughout the country as Census Depository Libraries (CDLs). The libraries are located in cities with a population greater than 25,000 and are not in a Metropolitan Statistical Area served by a Federal Depository Library (FDL). Just as the FDLs, the CDLs receive Census Bureau publications, CD-ROMs, and information free of charge and in exchange, provide local, public no-fee access, and assistance in using the information.
