The FJC provides one safe place where a survivor can go to access many different services. Having many providers in one location reduces the confusion for survivors and their supporters about where to start on their path to strength, safety and hope.

community referrals: Community partners and healthcare providers work with people experiencing domestic violence or who have experienced sexual assault can refer their clients to the FJC and trust that the client will be able to connect with needed resources there.

**ATTORNEYS:** Many attorneys represent victims of domestic violence or sexual assault in civil legal matters. These attorneys can refer their clients to the FJC to access counseling and support.

victim turns for help is the court system. They may seek a restraining order from a judge or go to a magistrate to take out criminal charges. Court officials may refer victims to the FJC where they can meet with a court advocate and/or an attorney and learn more about the court process.

sexual assault can come to the FJC to obtain no charge medical exams and evidence collection by Forensic Nurse Examiners. Victims do not have to report the assault to law enforcement but if they chose to, they can speak with the law enforcement officers at the FJC.

**LAW ENFORCEMENT:** Officers responding to domestic or sexual assault calls may refer the victim to the Family Justice Center to access supportive services and find out about legal options.

of domestic violence survivors in Buncombe County, 37% had sought help from a leader in their faith communities. FJC staff are working with faith community leaders so they know where they can refer survivors for counseling and support.

### **REGISTEROFDEEDS**

The Register of Deeds office accepts cash, check, debit or credit card. Buncombe County is the first Register of Deeds office in the state to offer services in Spanish online, on the phone, and in person.

#### BIRTH, DEATH & MARRIAGE RECORDS

The vital records department of the Register of Deeds office is responsible for Buncombe County's:

• Birth Certificates • Death Certificates • Marriage Licenses & Certificates • Notary Public Commissions

Copies and information about these records can be obtained in person, online, or by mail. Vital records can only be issued to the individual, immediate family, or an authorized agent.

To obtain a marriage license for North Carolina, a couple must come to the Register of Deeds office with required identification. A North Carolina marriage license is valid for 60 days and the cost is \$60. Complete the marriage license application online at **buncombecounty.org/rod**.

#### PROPERTY RECORDS

The property records department of the Register of Deeds office is responsible for Buncombe County's:

- Real property records including deeds, easements, rights of way, and leaseholds.
- Instruments of security such as mortgages, deeds of trust, and UCCs.
- DBA or Assumed Name Certificates
- Powers of Attorney
- Plats or recorded surveys

Original documents can be presented for recording in person, by mail, or via eRecording and must adhere to North Carolina recording standards and fees.

Once recorded, all documents are public record and can be accessed online. Please visit **buncombecounty.org/rod** and click on Online Document Search.

#### **GET VITAL RECORDS ONLINE**

Buncombe County has made it easier to access vital records by allowing citizens to request and pay for birth, death, and marriage certificates online. The certificate will be mailed without requiring a visit to the Register of Deeds office. It's easy; simply fill out the required info, upload a photo ID, complete the payment, and the request will be processed within one business day. Visit buncombecounty.org/vital.



### **CLERKOFCOURT**

The Clerk of Court is an elected position and has jurisdiction over matters relating to the probate of wills and the administration of estates. The Clerk also presides over other legal matters including adoptions, incompetency proceedings, and foreclosures. In addition, the Clerk receives and disburses money collected each year from court fees and fines.

The Tax Department lists, appraises and assesses all real and personal property in Buncombe County, and collects tax payments for Buncombe County and other taxing districts.

### WHERE AND HOW CAN I PAY MY TAXES?

Property owners have several options for paying taxes:

- Pay online with credit card or online check at buncombecounty.org/paytaxes.
- Use the self-addressed envelope you receive with your bill.
- Pay by phone with credit card by calling 877-690-3729 use jurisdiction code 4301.
- Pre-authorized debit program 250-4910, call for details.
- Use the drive-up drop box located at 35 Woodfin Street or walk up box at 94 Coxe Ave.
- In person at the Tax Office at 94 Coxe Ave, in Asheville, Mon.- Fri. from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

# **ELDERLY & DISABLED EXCLUSION**

North Carolina permanent residents who:

- own and live in their own homes and
- are either 65 years of age or totally & permanently disabled as of January 1, 2016 and have an income of no more than \$29,500 per year

may be eligible for a reduction in their property taxes. Those qualified applicants may have the greater of \$25,000 or 50% of the appraised value of their permanent residence excluded from property taxes. Proof of income is required as well as an annual Social Security statement.

## DISABLED VETERANS EXCLUSION

This program excludes up to the first \$45,000 of the appraised value of the permanent residence of a permanent service connected disabled veteran. There is no age or income limitation for this program and it is also available to a surviving spouse who has not remarried. For more information, call **250-4910**.

## CIRCUIT BREAKER DEFERRED PROGRAM

Taxpayers who are 65 years of age or older who:

- have an income not to exceed \$44,250
- have owned and lived in their residence for at least 5 years

may qualify for a reduction or deferral in their taxes under this program. The deferral is based on income level:

- If your total income is \$29,500 or less, the total amount of tax you can be charged on your home is no more than 4% of your yearly income;
- If your total income is between \$29,501 to \$44,250 the total amount of tax that you can be charged on your home is no more than 5% of your yearly income.



In December of 2016, David Gantt will have served Buncombe County and its citizens for 20 years.

Mr. Gantt, a Democrat, was first elected to the Buncombe County Commission in 1996, was re-elected in 2000 and again in 2004. He was elected Chairman of the Buncombe County Commission in 2008 and has served in that capacity for the last 8 years. Recently, Chairman Gantt shared the Top 10 Achievements under his leadership of which he is particularly proud. They include:

- Construction of 11 new schools and dozens of major renovations of school facilities in Buncombe County, the City of Asheville and AB Tech, totaling over \$250 million.
- Partnership with other groups to preserve and permanently protect over 6,000 acres of Buncombe County farmland, ridge tops and special places.
- Creation of a landfill that may become the first perpetual facility in the U.S.
- Partnership with WNCCHS to provide expanded access for indigent care for county residents at no cost to them.
- Construction of a new \$25 million, LEED-certified County Courthouse after decades of need.
- County designation of AAA bond rating for Buncombe County that allows efficient financing options to enable lower borrowing rates.
- Creation of new businesses and over 6,000 new jobs through a strong economic incentive program, culminating in Buncombe's achievement of one of the lowest unemployment rates in the state.
- Establishment of countywide zoning and planning ordinances that began and maintain the practice of sustainable growth.
- Creation of greenways, pools, libraries and community centers in each part of the county. County investments in new construction, renovations and infrastructure additions total over \$693 million.

## LANDFILL& SOLID WASTE

The Landfill's mission is to protect the health and safety of all citizens by disposing of all waste generated in Buncombe County in the most efficient, cost effective and environmentally sound manner possible.

The Landfill takes in 500 tons or 1,000,000 pounds of trash every day. The Landfill accepts Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) materials on certain Fridays throughout the year. The schedule can be found online at **buncombecounty.org**.

HHW materials such as paint, paint thinner, kerosene and gasoline area accepted for \$2 per gallon, with a maximum 20 gallon limit. Other materials such as lawn and garden chemicals are accepted at no charge. If you have any questions about the landfill, call, call **250-5462** or visit **buncombecounty. org/solidwaste.** 

The Buncombe County Landfill accepts:

- 33 gallon bags of household waste with recyclables removed for \$2 per bag.
- Bags less than 33 gallons of household waste with recyclables removed are \$1 per bag.

### TRANSFER STATION

The Transfer Station at 190 Hominy Creek Road is open Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., and Saturday, 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. For more information, call **250-6205**.

The Buncombe County Transfer Station accepts:

- 33 gallon bags of household waste with recyclables removed for \$2 per bag.
- Bags less than 33 gallons of household waste with recyclables removed are \$1 per bag.

The Transfer Station accepts the following recyclables at no charge:

- · Lead acid batteries.
- White goods. (appliances)
- Newspapers and brown paper bags; office paper and mail; magazines and catalogs.
- · Corrugated cardboard.
- "Blue Bag" or commingled recyclable containers, including plastic bottles and jugs; aluminum cans; clear green and brown glass bottles/jars; and steel cans.
- Moving Boxes: Drop off corrugated moving boxes and shipping cartons for reuse.

(Please break down and flatten the boxes.)

 Medical Equipment: Anyone who wishes to pass along walkers, wheelchairs, canes or crutches should bring them to the Buncombe County Landfill. The medical equipment will be loaned to patients who need it temporarily or given to people who will use it permanently.
