# **Evaluation Form for Qualifying Examination: Portfolio**

**Item Selection:** In preparing the portfolio, students should carefully select items to be included in each of the 5 sections, particularly Scholarly Writing, Presentations, and Creative Works. Each section outlines a minimum and maximum number of items for that section. The total number of items included in the portfolio should be no less than 12 and no greater than 18.

Rating Scale: Each item in the portfolio will be rated on the following scale:

- (0) Unacceptable; item is either missing or does not meet the standards outlined for that item
- (2) Meets standards; item meets the standards of performance required for that item
- (4) Exceed standards; item exceeds the standards of performance required for that item

#### A) Curriculum Vitae/Resume

#### Requirements:

Provide your current CV

Document should address but is not limited to contact information, education, professional experience, research interests, honors and awards, publications, and professional & civic activities

#### Standards:

Organized logically and is visually attractive Highlights or emphasizes key information Articulated concisely and accurately Includes accomplishments that are consistent with student's goals Demonstrates student's participation in leadership and service, as well as educational activities

Requirements:

Provide a 2-page professional overview of and introduction to the contents of the portfolio Include reflection on intellectual growth, scholarly/research interests, and professional goals.

Include a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 10 examples of scholarly writing

At least 2 examples must be published or accepted for publication:

One in a state or regional peer-reviewed journal

One in a national or international peer-review journal

All examples must be formatted and documented according to APA guidelines or those of the accepted publication.
