Any music major may begin the undergraduate composition program by enrolling in MUCP 1180 - MUCP 1190 (Beginning Composition I and II), which is to be taken either concurrently with or following successful completion of MUTH 1400 - MUTH 1410 or MUTH 1500 -MUTH 1510. Continuation in the program is contingent upon meeting the requirements outlined in the composition division policies and procedures
