
## UNT College of Music Cost of Attendance Facts 2014++

At UNT, any competitive scholarship of \$1,000 or more per academic year guarantees in-state tuition rates.


In the 2013-14 academic year:


- The College of Music awarded \$891,294.00 in scholarships+++
- One third of students (550 out of 1602) received merit scholarships from the College of Music\*\*\*
- More than one fourth of graduate students (177 out of 591) received teaching assistantships or fellowships\*\*\*
- In-state tuition and fees at UNT averaged \$8,745/year for undergraduates and \$6,935/year for graduates






