## John Hedlund

**Head Coach**

**23rd Year ▶ Midwestern State '84**

Having established himself as one of the most prominent coaches in the Central Region, John Hedlund has molded the Mean Green soccer program into one of the nation's elite. The only head coach in program history, Hedlund has amassed 314 career wins, which ranks him 19th all-time among Division 1 head coaches.

Hedlund has had a winning season all 22 years at North Texas; only Anson Dorrance (North Carolina, 38 years), John Daly (William & Mary, 35 years) and G Guerrieri (Texas A&M, 24 years) have active streaks of more winning seasons at one school. Since 1995, Hedlund has led North Texas to a 314-120-27 record (71.0 percent), the 13th-best winning percentage among active Division I coaches.

On Aug. 19, 2016, Hedlund became the 20th NCAA Division I women's soccer coach to reach 300 career wins with a season-opening 4-0 victory against Incarnate Word.

Hedlund is the winningest coach in any sport in the history of North Texas athletics. His twelve total conference championships leads all North Texas sports in the recent era.

Hedlund continued his winning tradition in his 22nd season. He started the season by recording his 300th career win and finished it by capturing the Mean Green's third straight Conference USA regular-season conference title. The Mean Green went 9-1 in conference play, only the second time that a North Texas team has won nine league games. North Texas earned the No. 1 seed in the Conference USA Championship but ultimately lost in the semifinals.

Rachel Holden became just the third Mean Green player to earn all-conference honors four years in a row. The forward finished her career ranking in the top 10 at North Texas in goals and points.

North Texas continued its winning ways at home, setting a school record with a 17-consecutive win streak, dating back to the 2015 season. The Mean Green also continued their unbeaten streak at home against conference opponents to 39 games, tied for the longest in the nation.

The 2015 season might go down as the best team in program history. The Mean Green won a school-record 19 games, en route to winning back-to-back regular season titles. The team won its first Conference USA tournament championship and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in school history. The 2015 team was ranked as high as No. 3 in the central region and received votes in the national poll throughout the season.

Hedlund guided the program into the Conference USA era in 2013, and earned the league's No. 2 seed and a trip to the C-USA title game. It took three tries but the Mean Green finally won its first Conference USA tournament championship in 2015.

Hedlund has coached 76 all-conference players since 1999, including the 2015 C-USA Co-Offensive Player of the Year and Midfielder of the Year. His players have won three Sun Belt Player of the Year awards and four Sun Belt Freshmen of the Year awards. In the three years in Conference USA, Hedlund has coached two offensive players of the year, one defensive, midfielder and freshman players of the year.

He has won three Sun Belt Coach of the Year awards, the latest in 2011. He has been recognized as the North Texas Coach of the Year by the Dallas Morning News and the Dallas All Sports Association, and the Greater Denton Sports Commission two years in a row.

At home, North Texas has established a record of dominance with a record of 167-26-12, including an 90-13-6 mark in 10 seasons at the Mean Green Soccer Complex.

Hedlund started the program from scratch in 1995 by implementing a game plan that emphasizes recruiting from the surplus of talent available in the Lone Star State.

His standard for success began in 2001 when he guided the Mean Green to the Sun Belt Conference's regular-season championship -- the program's first-ever soccer title -- and a 13-5 overall record.

Individually, Hedlund brought out the best in forward Marilyn Marin as she turned in the best individual season in North Texas history in 2002. Marin led the nation in goals, points, and points per game. She ended her career with 214 career points, tied for 10th in NCAA history, 88 goals, eight in NCAA history, 2.70 points per game, tied for seventh in NCAA history, and 1.11 goals per game, tied for eighth in NCAA history.

Hedlund led the Mean Green to its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament and a school-record 16 wins in 2004. Hedlund equaled that performance by winning 16 games and leading the Mean Green to back-to-back SBC titles in 2005 and a second straight trip to the NCAA Tournament. Hedlund was also named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. In 2005, North Texas set numerous school records and had the nation's third longest unbeaten streak at 15 games.

In 13 years in the Sun Belt Conference the Mean Green earned the respect of the league's coaches. NT garnered 47 all-conference selections, including 35 first-team all-conference nods.

Marin, Kendall Juett, Holden are the only four-time all-conference selections in North Texas soccer history. Heather Hutyra became the second player at North Texas to the named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. Under Hedlund's guidance, four of his players have also been chosen Freshman All-America, including Marin as a first team pick in 2000. Freshman Janaye Woods joined that list she was named the Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year and named to the Freshman All-Region team in 2007.

Five women's soccer players have been inducted to the North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame. Krista Davey was the first soccer player to be inducted in 2005, followed by Christy Johnson in 2007 and Marilyn Marin in 2008. Melinda Pina was voted into the Hall of Fame in 2011, and Heather Hutyra joined them in 2013.

Under Hedlund, the Mean Green have also succeeded in the classroom, boasting an overall 3.4 team GPA in 2000 and twice being named the school's All-Academic Team in 1998 and 1999. The team was recognized for its off-field accomplishments by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America as one of the recipients for the 2010 and 2014 NSCAA Team Academic Award. The NSCAA annually hands out the academic honor to Division I schools whose team grade point average is a 3.0 or higher. The Mean Green posted a team grade-point average of 3.22 for the 2013-14 school year.

Hedlund's association with North Texas began in 1990 as an assistant men's soccer coach. He served briefly as the head coach of the men's program in 1994 before the university discontinued the sport.

In 1995, Hedlund concluded a 12-year professional playing career, in which he played defender for the United States Men's Olympic qualifying team (1983-84), the New York Express (1984-85), the Dallas Sidekicks (1986-87 and 1992-95) and the Dallas Rockets (1988-91).

In four seasons with the Sidekicks, he scored 15 goals in 78 games over four seasons, and ranks 19th in team history in shots blocked and 33rd in games played. He was a member of the 1986-87 and 1993 Sidekicks championship teams, blocking a total of 20 shots during his playoff career, the 12th-most in Sidekicks history. He scored five goals in the 1994 CISL playoffs for the Sidekicks, and ranks 20th in club history in playoff goals.

In the outdoor game, Hedlund played with the Richardson Rockets, who won the 1991 SISL Championship and reached the 1991 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Final. Hedlund helped the Rockets reach new heights in American soccer by reaching the fourth round of the 1992 CONCACAF Champions Cup. The Dallas Rockets were one of only three United States teams to reach the fourth round of the Champions Cup in the pre-Major League Soccer era (1969-1994), but fell in the fourth round to Club America in Estadio Azteca in Mexico City. He played with the United States Olympic team under Manfred Schellscheidt in the lead up to the 1984 Summer Olympics, but missed the Olympic Tournament due to injury. With the United States, Hedlund played tournaments in South Korea, Sweden, Finland and Malaysia.

A four-year letterwinner at Midwestern State University, Hedlund was twice voted to the NAIA All-America team in college. He scored 26 goals and added 12 assists, playing several different positions on the pitch. He was named the Most Valuable Player in the 1983 NAIA National Tournament, as he led the Mustangs to the championship game. He is a member of Midwestern State's Athletic Hall of Honor.

The Plano native holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Midwestern State and resides in Argyle with his wife, Julie. They have two sons: Chad, who played football at Wake Forest and SMU and Cole, who plays football at Arkansas after setting the national high school football record for field goals made for Argyle High School in 2011.

## Daniel Dobson

**Assistant Coach/Recruiting Coordinator**

**Sixth Year ▶ Memphis**

Daniel Dobson returns for his fourth season as the top assistant on John Hedlund's coaching staff. He serves as the top recruiting assistant and also coaches the field players.

After a successful run in Major League Soccer, Dobson started coaching as a part-time assistant at North Texas and moved into a full-time position in 2014.

Since Dobson joined the Mean Green, he has helped lead North Texas to four regular-season titles, two conference tournament championships and two trips to the NCAA tournament. He also helped lead North Texas to wins over Power 5 conference teams, including TCU, Oregon State and Oklahoma.

In 2016, Dobson helped lead the Mean Green to their third straight Conference USA regular-season conference title. The Mean Green went 9-1 in conference play, only the second time that a North Texas team has won nine league games. North Texas earned the No. 1 seed in the Conference USA Championship but ultimately lost in the semifinals.

Rachel Holden became just the third Mean Green player to earn all-conference honors four years in a row. The forward finished her career ranking in the top 10 at North Texas in goals and points.

In 2015, Dobson helped coach the Mean Green to what might go down as the best team in program history. North Texas won a school-record 19 games, en route to winning back-to-back regular season titles. The team won its first Conference USA Championship and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in school history. The 2015 team was ranked as high as No. 3 in the central region and received votes in the national poll throughout the season. North Texas also beat TCU, 1-0, on the road.

Dobson mentored nine all-conference players, including C-USA Co-Offensive Player of the Year Rachel Holden, Midfielder of the Year Karla Pineda and first-team all-conference goalkeeper Jackie Kerestine.

The 2014 team won its first Conference USA regular-season title behind a record of 16-5-1 and 14 shutouts. Rachel Holden, Karla Pineda and Jackie Kerestine received all-conference honors for their play in 2014. North Texas also defeated Oregon State (Pac 12) at home.

In 2013, North Texas defeated two Big 12 teams: at TCU (2-0) and at Oklahoma (5-0). North Texas finished second in C-USA and advanced to the conference finals. Dobson helped coach the 2013 C-USA Offensive Player of the Year (Rachel Holden) and 2013 C-USA Defensive Player of the Year (Kelsey Hodges). Hodges went on to sign a professional contract with the Seattle Sounders Women in 2014 and a Division I team in Sweden.

As a player, Dobson was a standout for Memphis from 2001-04. He was named team captain for his senior year and led the Tigers win a C-USA regular season and tournament championship. That year, Memphis was ranked as high as No. 10 in the nation, the highest-ever ranking for Memphis. He became the first Memphis product to sign a Major League Soccer contract, and spent time with both the Kansas City Wizards and Chivas USA.

After his playing career, Dobson has spent 10 years coaching club, academy, high school and collegiate soccer squads throughout the Metroplex. This will be his sixth season with the Mean Green program.

Dobson is a graduate of Naaman Forest High School in Garland, Texas. He and his wife, Casey Fields Dobson, have two sons, Luke and Casen.



## Fleur Benatar

**Assistant Coach**

**Third Year ▶ North Texas**

Fleur Benatar begins her third season as an assistant coach with the North Texas soccer program after serving as the director of operations in 2015. Benatar is a familiar face to the Mean Green. She is a former player (1996-97) and assistant coach (2000-01).

In 2016, Benatar helped lead the Mean Green to their third straight Conference USA regular-season conference title. The Mean Green went 9-1 in conference play, only the second time that a North Texas team has won nine league games. North Texas earned the No. 1 seed in the Conference USA Championship but ultimately lost in the semifinals.

Rachel Holden became just the third Mean Green player to earn all-conference honors four years in a row. The forward finished her career ranking in the top 10 at North Texas in goals and points.

Benatar has coaching experience throughout the Dallas-Fort Worth area at the club level, with the Olympic Development Program (ODP) and with US Soccer.

As John Hedlund's assistant, Benatar helped lead the 2001 North Texas team to the regular-season Sun Belt Conference Championship and a 13-5 record.

Benatar has 20 years of experience coaching club soccer. She is currently the head coach of the Liberty FC 99 team. She also has worked with the Sting Soccer Club, the Solar Soccer Club and Liverpool FC America.

For the last two years, she has worked as a staff coach for Region III of the Olympic Development Program where she evaluated, coached and mentored top soccer players in the region.

A graduate of Richardson (Tex.) High School, Benatar played college soccer for two seasons at the University of Arkansas before transferring to North Texas in 1996.

## Tyler Powell

Tyler Powell begins his first season as the goalkeeper coach with the North Texas women's soccer team. Powell has coaching experience at

the club, collegiate and professional level.

Powell currently works as the director of coaching for FC Dallas West Division. He was the head men's soccer coach at Texas Wesleyan from 2011-17 before leaving to join FC Dallas. He left the Rams as the program's coaching leader in wins with 57.

In six seasons with the Rams, Powell led the Rams to an overall record of 57-44-12 (.564) and an appearance in the NAIA National Championship opening round. Under his guidance, the program boasted 14 all-conference selections, 10 NAIA scholar-athletes and one NAIA All-American.

In 2012, Powell led the Rams to a 10-win season, and made the program's first appearance in the NAIA National Tournament opening round. The Rams played No. 7 University of Mobile to a 0-0 draw before Mobile advanced in penalty kicks (7-6). The following year Powell's team came within one win of matching the school's single season record, finishing at 13-6-1.

Powell came to Texas Wesleyan from Northwood University where he served as head women's soccer coach for two seasons (2009-10). He led the Knights to an overall record of 26-9-1 and a perfect 15-0 in Red River Athletic Conference play during his tenure. The Knights won back-to-back regular season RRAC Championships. In 2010, Northwood won the RRAC tournament championship, advanced to the NAIA National Tournament, and Powell was named RRAC Coach of the Year. Powell coached 12 all-conference players including the 2009 Player of the Year. In both seasons, his teams featured the conference newcomer of the year.

Powell's collegiate coaching career began in 2002 when he served as the lead assistant for the Richland College men's program that won the NJCAA National Championships. After two seasons at Richland, his career continued as an assistant with the St. Mary's University men and women's programs (2004-05), and as the head coach of the Eastfield College women's team (2005-06).

Powell was an assistant coach at Ursuline Academy of Dallas from 2001-2003, where he won two 5A State Championships. He has coached club for Solar Soccer Club (Dallas), Dallas Texans Soccer Club and Andromeda FC-West.

From 2010-12, Powell also spent time as head coach and general manager of the women's semi-pro team, American Eagles of the WPSL. In 2012, the team advanced to the regional finals and lost in a double overtime battle.

Powell holds a NSCAA Premier Diploma, a USSF National "B" License, and a USSF Youth National License.

He played college soccer at Richland College and Texas A&M International. After college, he played four years in the USL PDL League for the Texas Spurs, the Laredo Heat and the Rowdies.

He received his bachelor's degree from Wayland Baptist in management with a minor in health studies and is working on his master's degree in sports administration from the University of Miami.

Powell lives in Trophy Club with his wife, Crystal, their son, Trent (9), and their daughters, Camryn (6) and Téadora (2).

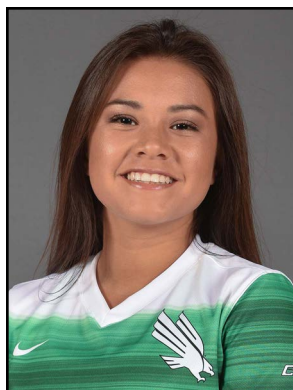

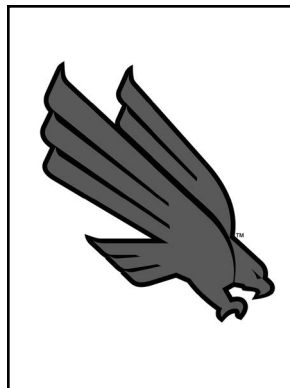

The North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1981 to acknowledge former athletes, coaches and administrators whose accomplishments have brought credit to the University of North Texas and had a special impact on Mean Green athletics.

The current North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame is located in the North Texas Coliseum, also known as the Super Pit, and features plaques that highlight the accomplishments of those inducted.

The new T.D. Parks Hall of Fame is located in the North Texas Athletic Center and features memorabilia from past North Texas greats. The T.D. Parks Hall of Fame also honors a myriad of great North Texas teams and has an interactive area where fans may read about all 192 members of the North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame.

Inductees are honored each fall at a banquet held in Apogee Stadium before the North Texas Homecoming game. The North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame stands for many things, foremost being sportsmanship, character and integrity. Since the Hall of Fame's creation, 192 people have been inducted.

Six women's soccer players have been inducted to the North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame. Krista Davey became the first soccer player to be inducted in 2005, followed by Christy Johnson in 2007 and Marilyn Marin in 2008. Melinda Pina was voted into the Hall of Fame in 2011, Heather Hutyra was enshrined in 2013 and Kendall Pruett was inducted in 2017.

### **KRISTA DAVEY (2005)**

Krista Davey became the first women's soccer player to be inducted in the North Texas Hall of Fame. Davey was one of six former Mean Green student-athletes inducted into the 2005 class. Davey was a four-year letterwinner with the women's soccer team (1996-99), joining the program one year after its inaugural campaign. The three-time First Team All-Big West Conference selection led the Mean Green to a 51-22-3 record during her career and helped build the foundation for a program that has never had a losing season. Davey was named to the Soccer Buzz First Team All-Central Region Team in 1997 and 1998 and still ranks among the top five players in every major statistical category.

### **CHRISTY JOHNSON (2007)**

Christy Johnson, a four-year letterwinner, was one of the pillars during the early years of North Texas women's soccer. Johnson left North Texas in 2000 as the all-time leader in goals, points, shots, and games started in her four-year career. She was a freshman All-American in 1997 and first-team all-central region player that year. In 1997, Johnson exploded for 22 goals during the season, which ranked sixth nationally. She was a four-time, first-team all-conference player at North Texas and was the first player in school history to be a four-time all-conference selection. She is third all-time at North Texas with 45 career goals and third in points with 112.

### **MARILYN MARIN (2008)**

Marilyn Marin ended her fabulous career with every offensive record in school history while leaving her mark on the NCAA. Marin had 214 career points, tied for 10th in NCAA history, 88 goals, eighth in NCAA history, 2.70 points per game, tied for seventh in NCAA history, and 1.11 goals per game, tied for eighth in NCAA history. In 2002 Marin turned in the best season in North Texas soccer history. She led the nation in points (67), goals (26), and points per game (3.53). She was the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 2002 and 2003 along with being named the Freshman of the Year in 2000. Marin was a four-time, first-team all-conference selection and a four-time all-central region selection. Marin is the first player in league history to be named to the first-team all-conference four straight years and capture back-to-back Player of the Year honors. In 2000, she was named to the Freshman All-America first-team after pouring in 24 goals, six assists, and 54 points on the season. In 2003, she had her third 20-goal season with 23 goals, 14 assists, and 60 points. She had 11 hat tricks for her career along with 23 games where she scored two goals or more.

### **MELINDA PINA (2011)**

Pina was a three-time first-team all-conference selection and a four-time all-tournament pick. She finished her career with 51 goals, which ranks second all-time and 122 career points, which still ranks third all-time. Pina ranks in the top 10 in seven different offensive categories for her career. She scored 21 goals in 2003 which was ranked sixth in the nation. Pina also averaged 2.13 points per game in 2003, which was tied for 15th in the nation that season. She led the team in goals in 2004 and led the Mean Green to the school's first ever Sun Belt Conference Championship and NCAA Tournament berth. Pina had four hat tricks in her four seasons.

### **Heather Hutyra (2013)**

Hutyra took the North Texas soccer team to new heights during her time as one of the most decorated players in school history. She finished her career as a three-time first-team all-conference selection. She was the 2004 Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year and helped lead North Texas to the NCAA Tournament and Sun Belt Conference Tournament title for the first time in school history, and set a single season freshman record with 83 shots, six goals and 17 points. In 2005, Hutyra powered the Mean Green back to the NCAA Tournament for a second straight season and was named the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year and first-team all-conference. She scored 20 goals that season and notched 47 points and was named the Sun Belt Conference Tournament MVP and to the All-Central Region team. In 2006, she was named first-team all-conference for a third-straight season and to the all-region third-team with 13 goals and 31 points for the season. In 2007, Hutyra tied for the team lead with 12 goals and was second with 32 points. She finished her career tied for second with 51 goals, third with 25 assists and second with 127 points.

### **Kendall Juett (2017)**

Juett manned the midfield from 2006 to 2009, and was just the second Mean Green player in school history to be named first-team all-conference all four years at North Texas. She recorded 34 points as a freshman in 2006, which tied for 10th most in a season in school history. Juett finished her career ranked eighth in career points with 89 and third in assists with 29. She also ranks 10th in career goals with 30. She had 10 game-winning goals, tied for eighth best in school history; had 267 career shots, sixth all-time; and had 137 shots on goal, second all-time. Her single-season marks include five game-winning goals, seventh highest at NT; and 12 assists, good for fourth all-time.

↳ **Program Starts With Lubbock Loss**

*September 2, 1995 - Texas Tech 3, North Texas 2*

LUBBOCK, Texas- North Texas began its women's soccer history at Texas Tech, but relinquished 1-0 and 2-1 leads before falling 3-2 to the Lady Raiders.

Lisa Whitfield scored the first goal in program history in the 23rd minute, scoring from the lower-right part of the box, giving North Texas its first ever lead over its Southwest Conference foe.

Angela Reike scored in the 76th minute from the top of the 18-yard box to give North Texas a 2-1 edge, but could not hold onto the lead. The Red Raiders equalized in the 80th minute and scored the game-winner in the 87th.

↳ **North Texas Finds Troy In A Catch-22**

*August 31, 1997 - North Texas 22, Troy 0*

LAKE CHARLES, La.- North Texas found itself completely outclassing Troy, and walked away with the biggest win in program history, a 22-0 thumping of the Trojans.

By the 20th minute, Christy Johnson had a hat trick and was well on her way to her five-goal total, and the Mean Green were up 5-0. Johnson had scored five the previous day against McNeese State, giving her a remarkable 10 goals in two days. Both of her five-goal games are tied for the North Texas single-game record.

In all, four North Texas players scored hat tricks; Krista Davey, the future WUSA player who had three assists as well, Lynette Osbourne, who scored four goals, Nikki Smetzer, who had two assists, and Johnson.

North Texas outshot Troy 57-0. The Mean Green were up 9-0 by the 28th minute and 13-0 by halftime. Official scoresheets in 1997, before computer scoring was standard, had spaces for only nine goals in a game, therefore the official box score for the game spans three pages.

↳ **Orange Burnt on Halloween**

*October 31, 1999 - North Texas 2, Texas 1 (OT)*

DENTON, Texas- North Texas brought in heavily favored, and regional giant Texas to Denton for the penultimate game of the 1999 season.

The Mean Green got the first breakthrough in the 16th minute when Carrie Kveton put a strike in to give North Texas a lead it would hold for almost forty minutes. The Longhorns tied the game in the 55th minute, which helped send the match to extra time at 1-1.

With 19 seconds left in the first overtime, Michelle Brophy scored on an assist from Adriana Caballero and sending the Mean Green into a delirious dogpile as 2-1 victors.

↳ **Kveton's PK Topples No. 9 SMU**

*September 1, 2000 - North Texas 3, #9 SMU 2 (OT)*

WACO, Texas- After fighting for 62 minutes, North Texas found itself down 2-0 to SMU in the 65th minute in a neutral site match in Waco, and set the stage for a Mean Green upset and comeback.

Teresa Vise scored for the Mean Green just a minute after falling down 2-0 on a 66th minute goal with an assist from Marilyn Marin. With a scant 1:46 remaining in regulation, and the Mean Green down a goal, North Texas got its break. SMU keeper Becca Leif was sent off, and Carrie Kveton sent home the ensuing penalty to send the match into overtime.

North Texas was able to take advantage of the 11-on-10 just 5:48 into overtime, as Kveton was sent to the spot again. She converted for her second goal of the game, and North Texas' only victory over an opponent ranked in the top 10.

↳ **Double Overtime Upset Over No. 21 Denver**

*October 10, 2003 - North Texas 3, #21 Denver 2 (2OT)*

DENTON, Texas- Just 24 seconds away from a draw, Kristen Campbell knocked in a loose ball in front of the net and gave the Mean Green the golden goal they needed to defeat Denver 3-2 in double overtime.

North Texas, looking for its first victory over a ranked team since 2000, opened up a 2-0 lead over the Pioneers by the 56th minute. Richelle Magahlaes scored in the 15th minute, and Melinda Pina doubled the lead in the 56th. However, the lead was fleeting, and Denver equalized with two more goals by the 62nd minute.

As the second overtime was ending, NT's Marilyn Marin dribbled into the left corner before centering the ball towards the Denver net. Campbell somehow got

control of the loose ball just a couple of yards from the goal line and was able to kick it into the net.

Marin had assists on all three goals for the Mean Green.

↳ **North Texas Wins Sun Belt Tourney**

*November 6, 2004 - North Texas 1, FIU 0*

MIAMI, Fla.- Alyssa Carrier headed in a free kick from Andrea Marak with only eight seconds remaining in the Sun Belt Championship game to give North Texas a 1-0 win at FIU, with the specter of extra time or penalties looming in front of a road crowd.

The win gave North Texas its first Sun Belt Tournament Championship and first bid to the NCAA Tournament.

↳ **Mean Green Repeat As Champs**

*November 5, 2005 - North Texas 2, South Alabama 0*

MOBILE, Ala.- Again playing in hostile territory, the Mean Green won its second straight Sun Belt Championship and returned to the NCAA Tournament with a 2-0 win at South Alabama.

North Texas got its first goal in the 43rd minute, as Tournament Most Outstanding Player Heather Hutyra scored her 20th goal of the season.

The Mean Green anchored back, and allowed just one shot in the second half, holding on to the slim lead. Julie Radford ended the tension by scoring her first goal of the season in the 75th minute, giving North Texas a two-goal lead which it would not relinquish.

↳ **Mean Green Soccer Complex Opens**

*August 31, 2006 - North Texas 2, Houston 1 (OT)*

DENTON, Texas- North Texas opened up Mean Green Soccer Complex with some late heroics, defeating Houston 2-1 in overtime to christen the new field.

Kristen Campbell took a feed from Kelli Lunsford 91 seconds into overtime and fired a laser past Houston keeper Shelby Scott to win the first game in the new complex. The victory also extended the home unbeaten streak to 15 games -- a streak that eventually reached 23 games.

Houston started the scoring in the 37th minute, but North Texas got an equalizer from Kendall Juett in the 68th minute.

↳ **North Texas downs Oklahoma**

*September 5, 2008 - North Texas 3, Oklahoma 2 (OT)*

DENTON, Texas- Kelli Lunsford, who missed most of 2007 due to injury, scored the game-tying and winning goals in a 3-2 overtime victory. She tied the game 2-2 in the 83rd minute, when she blasted a kick from about 35 yards out that sailed over the outstretched arms of Oklahoma goalkeeper Lisa Jett.

In overtime, the Sooners tried to clear the ball but it went right to Lunsford, who took a shot from over 20-yards out and nailed it for the game winner.

North Texas scored the first goal of the contest, before Oklahoma came roaring back, scoring two goals within a 10-minute span at the end of the first half.

↳ **Crocco's Game-winning Goal Downs SMU**

*September 2, 2011 - North Texas 2, SMU 1*

DENTON, Texas- Nikki Crocco scored the game-winning goal in the 86th minute to give North Texas a 2-1 win over SMU. The victory over SMU was the program's first since 2005.

Crocco started the scoring in the 53rd minute with a header off a free kick taken by Kelsey Hodges from beyond midfield. North Texas' celebrations were short-lived, as its backline could not cope with an SMU cross and knocked it into their own net to tie the score.

With extra time looming, Nikki Crocco stole the ball from SMU keeper Courtney Webb with 3:07 remaining and knocked the ball into the open net which sent the record crowd of 1,287 into a frenzy, and gave the Mean Green the victory.

## ↳ Hodges' Goal, Block, Gives North Texas Regular Season Title

*October 28, 2011 - North Texas 1, Denver 0*

DENTON, Texas- Kelsey Hodges scored on a free kick from beyond midfield to give North Texas a 1-0 win over Denver, and clinch the 2011 Sun Belt regular season title. Hodges scored in the fifth minute -- her seventh goal of the season -- on a free kick from beyond midfield. Hodges has now scored in two straight games despite playing as the defensive anchor.

With the Mean Green hanging on to a 1-0 lead in the 63rd minute, Hodges made what was possibly the play of the game by blocking a Nichollette DiGiacamo shot with her face. Hodges left the game for a short time before returning to finish the contest and help North Texas win the Sun Belt title.

## ↳ Freshman Haggerty Punches NT's Third NCAA Tourney Ticket

*November 4, 2012 - North Texas 1, FIU 0*

MOBILE, Ala. - Freshman Amber Haggerty punched NT's ticket to another NCAA Tournament when her 63rd minute goal downed FIU in the Sun Belt Tournament final. The game was the final to be played by North Texas in the Sun Belt Conference, a league it has been a member of for 13 years.

The victory also marked the 250th win in the program's history and the coaching career of head coach John Hedlund.

North Texas would go on to face Texas Tech in its third trip to the NCAA Tournament since 2004.

## ↳ 5-0 Blanking Of Oklahoma Caps Historic Two-Week Stretch

*Sept. 15, 2013 - North Texas 5, Oklahoma 0*

NORMAN, Okla. - Freshman Rachel Holden confounded the Sooners defense all afternoon, scoring her second hat trick of the season in a 5-0 torching of Oklahoma. The victory capped an incredible two-week stretch for North Texas, which included a 4-0 record, a 12-0 scoring margin and a shutout streak of 382:11.

In that four-game stretch, NT downed Sam Houston State (3-0) and McNeese State (2-0) at home, and picked up road wins at TCU (2-0) and Oklahoma (5-0) on national TV.

Holden was named C-USA Offensive Player of the Week after the win at OU, while goalkeeper Haley Riley earned C-USA Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 9.

## ↳ Mean Green Advance To C-USA Title Game In First Season

*Nov. 10, 2013 - North Texas 0, Colorado College 3*

HOUSTON - In the Mean Green's first year in Conference USA, North Texas earned the league's No. 2 seed after the regular season and advanced to the league's tournament title game. Top seeded Colorado College was the only thing separating the Mean Green between its second straight trip to the NCAA Tournament, but the Tigers prevailed, 3-0.

Kelsey Hodges was named the C-USA Defensive Player of the Year, while freshman sensation Rachel Holden earned C-USA Offensive Player of the Year and Freshman of the Year.

## ↳ Mean Green Wins C-USA Regular-Season Title

*October 31, 2014 - North Texas 4, WKU 0*

The North Texas soccer team needed a tie or a win to secure sole possession of the 2014 Conference USA regular season title. The Mean Green delivered in usual fashion with a flurry of goals on offense and a shutout on defense in the 4-0 victory against WKU in front of a home crowd.

For a fourth straight game, North Texas scored an early goal and then waited until the second half to add to the score. Jackie Kerestine and the defense secured their 12th shutout of the season and the third straight. North Texas has outscored its opponents, 11-0 in the last three victories.

After Marchelle Davis gave North Texas a 1-0 lead in the 6th minute off a low shot past a diving keeper, the Mean Green did not find the goal again for more than 75 minutes. North Texas had its opportunities but seemed to miss that last pass or the on-target shot.

Anna Flobeck came off the bench to head in a ball sent from Tori Phillips on a free kick from 30 yards out at the 81-minute mark in the second half. That goal sparked the Mean Green offense, which went on to score three goals in a span of five minutes.

Amber Haggerty scored the next two goals off individual effort. She beat her defenders and shot the first one high that went in near post and the second was hit from the top of the penalty box

## ↳ Mean Green Repeats As C-USA Regular-Season Champions

*October 25, 2015 - North Texas 2, Rice 1*

DENTON - The North Texas soccer team captured the program's 10th conference championship with a 2-1 victory against Rice at the Mean Green Soccer Complex.

The Mean Green went undefeated in conference play to secure its second straight regular-season Conference USA championship. The game was a rematch of last year's conference tournament championship game, but this time the Mean Green came out on top.

North Texas scored twice in the opening 20 minutes, but then had to hold off a vigorous Rice attack after the Owls scored in the 72nd minute.

For the second straight game, the Mean Green scored in the opening minutes off its very first shot. Rachel Holden took possession of the ball after Jackie Moreau posted a long throw-in into the box. The junior forward shielded the ball from her defender, turned and had an open look at the goal. Her shot went into the upper right-hand corner of the goal in just the third minute of the game.

Karla Pineda caught the Rice goalkeeper by surprise in the 19th minute. The senior midfielder took a pass from Moreau just past the midfield circle and lofted a hard shot that went over the goalie's head.

Nia Stallings put Rice back into the game in the 72nd minute after getting a chipped ball into the box and then slotting it past a diving Jackie Kerestine. Right before the goal, Kerestine had made a low diving save that prevented a Holly Hargreaves shot from going in.

## ↳ Mean Green Wins First Conference USA Championship

*November 8, 2015 - North Texas 1, Marshall 0*

MIAMI -- The North Texas soccer team won its first Conference USA tournament championship and headed back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2012 with the 1-0 victory against Marshall at the FIU Soccer Complex.

For the third straight conference tournament game, North Texas scored an early goal and then relied on its defense to preserve the lead.

The goal was scored by senior Amber Haggerty in the 15th minute off her own rebound. The forward collected the ball inside the 18-yard box off a long throw-in from Marchelle Davis. Her header went off the crossbar, and Haggerty was right there for the put back.

The last time that North Texas won a conference tournament championship and went on to the NCAA Tournament was in 2012. Haggerty scored the game-winning goal in that 2012 championship game versus FIU as a freshman. Three years later, Haggerty repeated that feat.

Jackie Kerestine preserved the shutout victory with a diving save in the 86th minute off a header from a corner kick. The senior earned her 15th shutout of the season, breaking her own single-season school record set last year.

The Mean Green defense posted three shutouts en route to the tournament title. As a team, the 2015 team set a team record for shutouts with 16.

Rachel Holden was named the Offensive MVP of the tournament, Jackie Kerestine received Defensive MVP honors and Tess Graham and Amber Haggerty were named to the all-tournament team.

## ↳ Mean Green Wins Third-Straight Regular Conference USA Championship

*October 30, 2016 - North Texas 3, Louisiana Tech 1*

On a day when five Mean Green seniors were honored, it was the seniors that led the North Texas soccer team to a 3-1 win against Louisiana Tech, capturing the Conference USA regular-season title outright.

Three seniors were involved in all three goals for the Mean Green. For the fourth time, Hailey Sutton scored the opening goal to put North Texas ahead in the 14th minute. After Louisiana Tech tied the game off a free kick, Marchelle Davis gave the Mean Green the lead again in the 45th minute with a penalty kick. Rachel Holden sealed the win with a header off a free kick in the 82nd minute. Davis had two assists in the game.

The game took a sharp turn in the 32nd minute when junior defender Tori Phillips received a red card and was ejected for retaliating after she was fouled. With the score tied, 1-1, the Mean Green were forced to play with 10 players for the rest of the game.



↳ Since the program's birth in 1995, the Mean Green has never had a losing season. North Texas' 22-year combined record stands at 314-120-27 - a .710 winning percentage.

↳ North Texas has won 12 conference championships, including eight regular-season titles.

↳ John Hedlund has been at the helm of the Mean Green soccer program since its inception. Only Anson Dorrance (North Carolina, 38 years), John Daly (William & Mary, 35 years) and G Guerrieri (Texas A&M, 24 years) have active streaks of more winning seasons at one school.

↳ John Hedlund has led North Texas in all 22 years of the program's existence, and his 314 wins rank 19th all-time among Division I coaches and 17th amongst active coaches.

↳ The ultimate goal of the program, North Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament four times - 2004, 2005, 2012 and 2015. Only five Division I schools in the state of Texas (of 20) have more NCAA Tournament appearances. In C-USA, only Charlotte has more tourney bids.

↳ Not one player on the Mean Green roster has ever lost a home game in conference play. NT is 41-0-2 in league play since its last home conference loss on Halloween of 2008 - a span of eight full seasons.

↳ The Mean Green won back-to-back regular-season conference titles in 2014 and 2015. That feat has been accomplished three times in school history.

↳ The Mean Green won three straight regular-season titles in 2014, 2015 and 2016; the first time that has been accomplished in school history.

↳ The 2015 team won a school-record 19 games, en route to winning back-to-back regular season titles. The team won its first Conference USA Championship and advanced to the NCAA tournament for the fourth time in school history.

↳ The 2015 team was ranked as high as No. 3 in the central region and received votes in the national poll throughout the season.

↳ The 2015 team tied a school record with six players being named all-conference. Rachel Holden became the second player in school history to receive a specialty award twice in her career. Holden was named Conference USA Co-Offensive Player of the Year. She also received the award in 2013.

↳ The Mean Green won its first Conference USA title by taking the regular-season conference championship in 2014. North Texas finished as runner-up in the conference tournament championship.

↳ The 2014 team tied a then program record with 16 wins and set a then single-season record with 14 shutouts. The team also was the NCAA statistical champion for save percentage.

↳ The Mean Green's first season in C-USA in 2013 can be seen as nothing but a success. NT went 14-7-1 overall, earned the league's No. 2 seed

and advanced to the C-USA Tournament finals. The Mean Green also brought home a host of major awards and notched two wins over Big 12 opponents, while also taking No. 10 Wake Forest and Oklahoma State to overtime.

↳ North Texas won its second straight and fifth overall regular season Sun Belt title in 2012.

↳ In 13 years in the Sun Belt, North Texas advanced to at least the semifinals of the league tournament 12 times, and made nine finals appearances. NT won three SBC Tournament championships.

↳ Since the Mean Green Soccer Complex opened in 2006, North Texas is a gaudy 90-13-6 (84 percent) at home.

↳ With the win in the 2012 Sun Belt Tournament final, John Hedlund became just the 25th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach the 250 win plateau.

↳ John Hedlund has produced 76 all-conference players since 1999. He coached three Sun Belt Players of the Year and four Sun Belt Freshmen of the Year. He has coached two Conference USA Offensive Players of the Year, one C-USA Midfielder of the Year and one C-USA Defensive Player of the Year. He has won three Sun Belt Coach of the Year awards, the latest in 2011.

↳ North Texas boasts three players who have been named freshman All-Americans. - Christy Johnson (Third Team, 1997), Gina Turner (HM, 1998), Marilyn Marin (First Team, 2000).

↳ Mean Green players have accounted for 20 All-Central Region team selections.

↳ North Texas has eleven 15 or more-win seasons in school history, including a stretch of six straight from 2003-2008.

↳ Heather Hutyra became the youngest player in the Sun Belt Conference to earn Player of the Year honors as a sophomore in 2005. She was inducted to the North Texas Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013.

↳ North Texas has been awarded conference freshman of the year honors five times. The latest recipient was Rachel Holden in 2013 after a 12-goal campaign. Janaye Woods won in 2007, Kelli Lunsford received the award in 2005, Heather Hutyra was named freshman of the year in 2004, and Marilyn Marin received the honor in 2000.

↳ The 2007 team had the best start in school history with a 13-2 mark through 15 games, and had two separate six-game winning streaks - a first in school history.

↳ In 2007, North Texas advanced to its eighth straight SBC Tournament final. At the time, NT was the only school in league history to play in the championship game each year.

↳ Kendall Juett (2006-09) became the second player in school history to be named first-team all-conference all four years, joining two-time Sun Belt Player of the Year Marilyn Marin.

↳ The 2004 squad set a school record with 16 wins and its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament after capturing the program's first Sun Belt Conference Tournament Championship.

↳ The 2003 squad tied a then school record with 15 wins and went a perfect 11-0 at home. The undefeated season at home was the first since 2001 and the third in the program's history.

↳ Marilyn Marin became the first North Texas player to win back-to-back Player of the Year honors in the Sun Belt Conference. She was also named to the first-team all-conference squad for a fourth straight year.

↳ In 2002, North Texas was second in the nation in goals per game and forward Marilyn Marin, who led the nation in goals, points, and points per game, was named the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year.

↳ In 2001, the Mean Green captured its first Sun Belt Conference regular-season championship in just the second year of the league sponsoring women's soccer. North Texas went a perfect 5-0 at home against Sun Belt opponents en route to a unblemished 7-0 home record for the season.

↳ In 2002 the Mean Green set a school record with 13 consecutive wins at home and a 24-game unbeaten streak at home.
