Seth Littrell

Head Coach

First Year → Oklahoma '01

The University of North Texas named Seth Littrell as its 19th head football coach, University President Neal Smatresk announced on December 5, 2015.

Littrell, 37, one of the brightest offensive minds in college football, comes to North Texas after serving as the assistant head coach for offense and tight ends at North Carolina. The Muskogee, Oklahoma, native is the youngest coach in Conference USA and will be the fifth youngest in the nation when he coaches his first game.

The dynamic mind of Littrell turned the North Carolina offense in 2015 into one of the nation's best, as the Tar Heels set school records for most points and touchdowns in a season. The Tar Heels won the ACC Coastal Division Championship and played in their first ACC Championship game.

North Carolina scored over 30 points nine times in 2015, topped the 40-point mark seven times and scored over 50 points in four games, which is a school record. Through 12 games, UNC averaged 41.2 points a game, which was 11th in the nation.

Under the guidance of Littrell, quarterback Marquise Williams set a new school record for career touchdowns (90) and total offense at North Carolina.

In 2015 with Littrell, the UNC offense averaged 7.46 yards per play, which was second in the nation, and ran the ball for 6.0 yards a carry, which ranked third in the country. UNC was one of just 11 schools in the nation averaging more than 200 yards rushing (229.7) and 250 yards passing (266.0). UNC rushed for over 200 yards eight times and had over 500 yards of total offense in four games in 2015, including 704 yards in a 66-31 win over Duke.

In his first season in Chapel Hill in 2014, Littrell helped Carolina establish several school records, including most passing yards, most passing touchdowns and most first downs. Williams was a second-team all-conference pick after leading the Tar Heels to a bowl game in his first year as the starter, and set several individual school records, including most rushing yards and rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. Carolina gained more than 5,000 yards in Littrell's first season as the play-caller and averaged 429.8 yards per contest.

Littrell came to Chapel Hill from Indiana where he guided one of the most prolific offenses in the country. Indiana finished ninth in the nation in total offense in 2013, averaging 508.5 yards per game. The Hoosiers were 17th in passing offense (306.7 avg.) and 30th in rushing offense (201.8). Indiana was one of only three teams to average more than 300 yards passing and 200 yards rushing

Under Littrell's guidance in 2013, Indiana set single-season records with 6,102 total yards, (508.5 ypg), 461 points, (38.4 ppg), 36 passing touchdowns, 62 total touchdowns and 300 first downs. Tight end Ted Bolser thrived in his system, setting IU career records for receptions, receiving yards and touchdowns by a tight end.

Bolser and wide receiver Cody Latimer were selected in the 2014 NFL Draft. Latimer was taken in the second round (56th overall) by the Denver Broncos, while Bolser went in the seventh round to the Washington Redskins.

In Littrell's first season as Indiana's offensive coordinator in 2012, the Hoosiers led the Big Ten and ranked 17th nationally in passing offense (311.2). They finished second in the conference in total offense (442.0) and fourth in scoring offense (30.8).

Prior to his stint at Indiana, Littrell coached three seasons at Arizona, where his 2011 offense ranked third nationally in passing offense (370.8) and 15th in total offense (465.2). Three of his Arizona players were selected in the NFL draft: tight end Rob Gronkowski (New England Patriots - 2010 second round), quarterback Nick Foles (Philadelphia Eagles - 2012 third round) and wide receiver Juron Criner (Oakland Raiders - 2012 fifth round).

Prior to Arizona, Littrell served four years as running backs coach at Texas Tech (2005-08) under Mike Leach. The 2008 Red Raiders rushed for 119 rushing yards per game, the highest total in the Leach era. Running back Shannon Woods earned All-Big 12 Conference honors in 2006 after averaging 6.1 yards per carry and snagging 75 receptions, totaling a top 15 national figure of 139 all-purpose yards per game.

Littrell began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas from 2002-04. The Jayhawks played in the 2003 Tangerine Bowl.

Littrell has coached in seven bowl games, played in two and was team captain on Oklahoma's 2000 national championship team. He was a four-year letterwinner at Oklahoma where he rushed for 231 yards and seven touchdowns in 1999 and finished his career with 11 rushing scores.

The Muskogee, Oklahoma, native graduated from Oklahoma with a degree in communications in 2001.

Littrell and his wife, Becca, have a son, Tripp, and a daughter, Elle.

→ 2014 Heart of Dallas Bowl

January 1, 2014 North Texas 36 UNLV 14

DALLAS - For the first time in eleven years and the first time on New Year's Day in program history, the North Texas football team is a bowl champion.

In a game that epitomized the 2013-14 North Texas season, the Mean Green fell behind early but showed its boundless resiliency, methodically taking control of the game, battering the UNLV offense into submission, getting an efficient performance from senior quarterback Derek Thompson, and scoring a Heart of Dallas bowl-record 22 fourth-quarter points to roll to a 36-14 victory at the Cotton Bowl.

"Really proud of my football team," North Texas coach Dan McCarney said. "I dreamed of day these seniors could go to a bowl game and win a bowl game."

Thompson completed 21-of-30 passes for 256 yards and two touchdowns and no interceptions, and earned the game's Most Valuable Player award, while Brelan Chancellor scored two touchdowns on reverses, both in the fourth-quarter assault that sealed the win.

"We knew if we picked up the tempo that we could do some things and move the football," Thompson said. "We just made plays. I wasn't anything special that we did. We just executed. The defense did the rest."

There were a number of negative streaks facing the Mean Green coming into the game. North Texas had never won on New Year's Day (0-1), had never won at the Cotton Bowl (0-3) and had never beaten UNLV (0-4), and the Rebels had never lost a bowl game (3-0). But before a crowd of 38,380 - almost entirely outfitted in North Texas green - the Mean Green put all those streaks to rest.

Early on, however, UNLV's read-option offense sorely tested the Mean Green defense. The Rebels came into the game averaging 31 points and 423 yards a game, and backed up those stats on their opening drive with a 95-yard scoring march for a 7-0 lead.

But the North Texas defense adjusted quickly and reined in the Rebel attack. A pair of big losses - on a tackle by Will Wright and a sack by James Jones - marked the beginning of a relentless, merciless pounding of UNLV quarterback Caleb Herring.

"I was tellling the guys to settle in," said senior linebacker Zach Orr, who led North Texas with nine sacks and had two and a half sacks. "It was the first time we had played a football game in over a month, and I felt like that first drive we were kind of playing on our heels and not playing our great defense. It just really did bounce back after that drive, and we pretty much shut them out the rest of the game."

North Texas sacked Herring five times and hit him countless other times, forcing errant throws. North Texas also broke up six passes. After completing his first nine passes, Herring completed just six of his next 24 throws and was intercepted for just the fifth time this season when Kenny Buyers came up with his third interception.

It took longer for the North Texas offense to get going, as the Mean Green struggled to find consistency in the first half. A 43-yard run by Brandin Byrd on the game-opening drive was called back by a penalty, and from that point on the offense sputtered, converting just one of six third downs in the first half.

The Mean Green, however, got a break late in the opening period that got them even on the scoreboard. A punt to UNLV was jarred loose from Rebel return man Keith Whitely when one of his own blockers crashed into him as he was fielding the kick. Zed Evans recovered the fumble for North Texas at the UNLV 42.

Wide receivers Chancellor and Carlos Harris then sparked the offense and moved the Mean Green to the UNLV three with three reverses, something North Texas practiced again and again in the lead-up to the game. Antoinne Jimmerson scored from a yard out to tie the game.

With the game tied 7-7 at halftime, North Texas took complete control in the second half. UNLV had 192 yards of total offense in the first half, but just 20 in the third quarter and 50 in the fourth period, while the Mean Green offense found its legs.

The Mean Green took the lead for the first time on its first drive of the second half, a march capped by a Thompson-to-Drew Miller seven-yard touchdown pass and a 14-7 lead.

Chancellor, who had 181 all-purpose yards to shatter the North Texas career and single-season records, scored on a three-yard run, then Thompson dropped a perfect pass into Darnell Smith for a 34-yard score and a commanding 28-7 lead. Chancellor finished the North Texas scoring with another wide-receiver reverse, this one from 15 yards out.

NEW ORLEANS, La - Southern Miss quarterback Dustin Almond passed for 247 yards and all-America linebacker Michael Boley returned an interception for a touchdown in a 31-10 win over North Texas in the Wyndham New Orleans Bowl.

The North Texas offense was held to 78 yards rushing and 156 yards passing. Quarterback Scott Hall was sacked a season-high five times and was intercepted twice after having just two total interceptions in 11 regular-season games.

North Texas' standout freshman running back Jamario Thomas was held to 92 yards rushing, his lowest total since a Sept. 25 loss at Baylor. He finished his freshman campaign with 1,801 yards, the third-most by a freshman in NCAA history.

Sophomore Johnny Quinn led the team in receptions with eight, including an 11-yard touchdown pass to end the game. Quinn's fumble after a punt return led to the Golden Eagles' final score with two minutes to play in the game.

The Golden Eagles' offense scored only seven points in the second half despite putting up 173 yards of total offense. Darren McCaleb missed two field goals in the third quarter from distances of 33 and 42 yards.

North Texas won the turnover battle, 2-0, in the first half but was only able to convert on one of those opportunities. Senior Andy Blount recovered a fumble by kickoff returnman John Eubanks at NT's 19-yard line, which led to a Nick Bazuldua field goal from 24 yards.

It was the fourth straight trip to the New Orleans Bowl for North Texas after it completed a perfect 7-0 record in the Sun Belt Conference.

The Mean Green took the game's opening kickoff and marched 51 yards before settling for a 47-yard field goal to begin the scoring in the opening quarter.

Memphis responded with a 66-yard touchdown drive to take a lead it would never relenquish with 6:57 to play in the first quarter. The Tigers added another touchdown and a field goal in the second quarter to take a 17-3 halftime lead.

North Texas cut the lead to seven twice in the second half, both on touchdown runs by Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Year Patrick Cobbs. Cobbs broke a 35-yard touchdown late in the third quarter to cut the lead to 17-10, but Memphis came back with a touchdown of its own in the fourth quarter to seal the victory.

Cobbs led all rushers with 110 yards and two touchdowns and secured his place as the nation's leading rusher and nation's leading scorer. It was Cobbs' ninth straight game with over 100 yards rushing.

North Texas also held Memphis to just 88 yards rushing, which was the Tiger's lowest output of the season and the eighth Mean Green opponent held below the century mark of the year.

NEW ORLEANS, La. -- Five different Mean Green players came up with interceptions and running back Kevin Galbreath rushed for 130 yards and a touchdown to earn MVP honors as North Texas battled past Cincinnati, 24-19, on Tuesday to capture the second annual New Orleans Bowl.

In winning the school's first bowl game since 1946, North Texas broke out to a 24-7 third-quarter lead before holding off a fourth-quarter comeback effort by the Conference USA champion Bearcats.

North Texas got outstanding efforts in all phases of the game. The defense came up with a season-best five interceptions while the offense rode the legs of Galbreath for his eighth 100-yard rushing performance of the season.

And on special teams, Ja'Mel Branch set up a touchdown with a 36-yard kickoff return, Patrick Cobbs had a 50-yard kickoff return and punter Brad Kadlubar nailed five of seven punts inside the 20-yard line

Junior defensive back Jeremy Pearl highlighted the Mean Green's defensive play, returning his first career interception 27 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter that gave North Texas the lead for good.

Also pulling down interceptions for the Mean Green were defensive backs Don McGee and Markeith Knowlton in the first quarter, linebacker Chris Hurd in the second and linebacker Cody Spencer in the third.

Galbreath took home the game's Most Valuable Player trophy after rushing 28 times for 130 yards and one touchdown. North Texas redshirt freshman quarterback Andrew Smith threw for 126 yards with one interception of his own.

The Rams, who were making their fourth straight bowl game appearance, scored in every quarter to hold off the Mean Green, which won the Sun Belt Conference's first-ever football title and was playing in the school's first bowl game in 42 years.

Colorado State had four rushing touchdowns and quarterback Bradlee Van Pelt threw for another as the Rams (7-5) racked up 246 yards on the ground and passed for 129. They also intercepted one North Texas pass, recovered a fumble and blocked a Mean Green punt attempt that resulted in another score.

After North Texas had trimmed the CSU lead to 10 at 24-14 at halftime, the Rams scored in the third quarter when a Jason Ball punt was blocked and recovered in the end zone by game's Most Valuable Player, Ram defensive back Justin Gallimore.

Colorado State later scored twice in the fourth quarter on drives of 67 and 70 yards before North Texas's Justin Claborn blocked a Ram punt to set up the Mean Green's final TD drive.

North Texas sophomore quarterback Scott Hall completed 13 of 30 passes with two touchdowns, and junior running back Kevin Galbreath rushed 22 times for 108 yards.

Heath rebounded from his first-quarter mistake to hook up with Tommy Kalmanir on a 94-yard pass play in the second quarter to grab a 7-6 halftime lead.

Neither team scored in the third quarter and early in the fourth quarter the Wolf Pack mounted what would become the game-winning drive. The drive culminated with Nevada fullback Ernie Zeno scoring on fourth down and a foot.

The Eagles tried to rally and got into Wolf Pack territory, but a long pass from Zeke Martin to Abbey failed to connect and the Eagles went down to defeat.

Although the Eagles lost their last game, it was an outstanding season as NTSC won its second consecutive Lone Star Conference title.

HOUSTON, Texas -- Louis Reinzi caught a nine-yard touchdown pass from Billy Dinkle on fourth down with nine seconds left and Dinkle's point after carried the Eagles to a thrilling 14-13 win over the University of the Pacific in the first Optimist Bowl.

It was a significant game for several reasons, not the least being the final game as head coach at Pacific for the famous Amos Alonzo Stagg. It also capped the first season for Eagle head coach Odus Mitchell.

The winning score capped a 67-yard drive by the Eagles. North Texas led 7-0 at the half thanks to a 58-yard interception return for a touchdown by Ned McNeil.

The Eagles won despite being out-gained 274 to 94. The Eagles also had to play most of the game without starting quarterback Fred McCain, who was kicked out of the game in the first quarter for fighting.

For Stagg, the inventor of the T-formation, it was the only bowl game that he would coach during his 57 years as a college coach. Stagg became a head coach at Springfield College in 1890 and ammassed a career record of 329-190-35, which ranks third among all college coaches in career games coached. His Hall of Fame career came to a close with a loss at the hands of the Eagels.

Quarterback Mitch Maher completed 21-of-32 passes for 226 yards, no interceptions and a touchdown in the first half. But UNT could not get any kind of running game going, gaining just 89 yards on 34 carries and BSU forced UNT to throw in the second half.

UNT could have had a bigger lead at the half, but BSU stopped UNT three times on its own one-yard line and forced the Mean Green to settle for a field goal as the first half ended.

BSU drove 87 yards in nine plays midway through the fourth quarter to cut the lead to 20-17. Three plays later, Maher threw an interception, it was returned to the UNT six-yard line, and on the first play from scrimmage, BSU scored a touchdown to take the 24-20 lead with 5:38 left in the game.

Benny Cherry led the UNT defense with 13 tackles and a quarterback sack.

The Wolf Pack stormed back to score the next 10 points as Tony Zendejas kicked a 24-yard field goal to give Nevada a 17-10 lead with 11:29 left in regulation.

UNT tied the game by taking advantage of another Wolf Pack mistake, this time a fumbled punt. UNT had the ball first and 10 at the Nevada 12-yard line and on third and 10, quarterback Greg Carter completed a touchdown pass to Grady Davis to tie the game at 17 with 4:45 left in the contest.

UNT had one more chance to score, starting a drive from the UNR 29-yard line with 3:09 left. UNT lost seven yards on the drive and Todd Smith's 42-yard field goal attempt was no good.

Nevada won the coin flip to start the overtime and UNT had the ball on the Wolf Pack 15-yard line. UNT drove the ball of the UNR one-yard line, but couldn't put it in the end zone and missed a 26-yard field goal attempt when the snap was bobbled.

Zendejas, who had missed thee of four previous attempts, then made a 32-yard field goal on the first play of its overtime possession to win the game.

"Mean" Joe Greene

Greene played for the Pittsburgh Steelers from 1969-81. He was a Pro Bowl selection 10 times and was the NFL Rookie of the Year in 1969. He recorded 66 quarterback sacks in his career and is regarded as one of the greatest defensive tackles in the history of the NFL. The anchor of the famed "Steel Curtain" defense that led the Pittsburgh Steelers to four Super Bowl titles, he was inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame in 1987. Greene was inducted into the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in 1983. He was the fourth player selected in the 1969 NFL Draft after earning All-America honors at North Texas in 1968.

Abner Haynes

Haynes made his mark at North Texas as one of the first African-Americans to play college football in the southwest in 1957. He was an All-America pick in 1959 and signed with the Dallas Texans of the AFL after leading North Texas to the Sun Bowl. He was named AFL Player of the Year in 1960 and helped the Texans to the 1962 AFL Title. Haynes rushed for over 4,500 yards during his pro career and was an AFL All-Star from 1960-63. He had his number retired by the Kansas City Chiefs in 1988 and received the NCAA Silver Anniversary Award in 1985. In 2008, he was inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame.

Brian Waters

Waters has been one of the top offensive linemen in the NFL for several years, making four trips to the Pro Bowl and being named All-Pro twice. He was the recipient of the prestigious Walter Payton NFL Man of Year Award in 2009, being recognized for his charitable contributions in addition to his performance on the field. Waters was an undrafted free agent in 1999 before signing with and spending his entire career with the Kansas City Chiefs where he has been since 2000.

Ray Renfro

Renfro spent 12 years in the National Football League, all with the Cleveland Browns from 1952-1963. Renfro was a three-time selection to the Pro Bowl in 1953, 57 and 1960. He was drafted 48th overall in the 1952 NFL draft after a successful career at North Texas where he was named first team All-America running back by the Associated Press in 1951.

J.T. Smith

Smith earned his reputation in the NFL as one of the premiere punt returners of his time. Smith was selected to two Pro Bowl games and was once named first team All-Pro for his returning prowess, which he led the league with in both 1979 and 1980. He also led the NFL in receptions in 1987 as a member of the St. Louis Rams. Smith played 13 years with three different teams, including seven years with the Kansas City Chiefs, where he finished as the team's all-time leader in punt returns.

Cedric Hardman

Hardman played 12 years in the NFL, 10 with the San Francisco 49ers and two with the Oakland Raiders. Hardman was a first round draft pick (ninth overall) of the 49ers in 1970 and was a two-time Pro Bowl selection in 1971 and 1975. He is still the all-time sacks leader for the 49ers and was a member of the Raiders 1981 Super Bowl Championship team.

Media Availability for Coaches

North Texas head coach Seth Littrell will be available for media interviews on a regular schedule throughout the season. All requests for interviews at times other than the regularly-scheduled availabilities should be made through the Athletic Communications office. Requests for interviews of assistant coaches will be granted with prior approval of Coach Littrell and must be made in advance through the athletic communications office

Radio Show

Coach Littrell will hold his weekly radio show at 7:00 p.m. Tuesdays from Rudy's BBQ in Denton.

Press Conference

Coach Littrell will hold a press conference each week on Monday at 11:30 a.m. in the team meeting room at the Athletic Center. Requested players will be available to speak to the media outside of the practice field on Tuesdays. All player requests must be submitted to the North Texas athletics communications office by 12 p.m. on Monday. If a requested player is not available on Tuesday, he will be made available after practice on Wednesday.

Out of Town Media

Coach Littrell and his assistant coaches are also available by request to out-of-town media. Contact the athletic communications office to arrange these requests.

Player Interviews

All player interviews must be arranged through the athletic communications office. Player interviews will be conducted on Tuesday following practice or following practice on Wednesday if the requested player is not available on the day prior. Special exceptions may be granted to those media members needing to interview players prior to Tuesday practice at the discretion of the athletic communications office.

Covering Practice

North Texas football practices are closed to the media with the exception of the first five 20 minutes on Tuesday and Wednesday. No coaches or players will be available after Wednesday.

Mean Green on the Web

Statistics and news releases on North Texas football and all 16 Mean Green athletic programs are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week at www.Mean-GreenSports.com, the official website of North Texas Athletics.

Media Credentials

All requests for press, broadcast, photo and parking credentials should be made in writing at least one week prior to the requested game. Direct all requests to Jordan Stepp, by email to jordan.stepp@unt.edu or phone at 940-369-8329. All credentials that are not picked up prior to the day of the game will be left at the media will call.

Photographers

Credentials will only be issued to accredited photographers for a working purpose and should be requested in the same manner as regular media passes. Photographers with a credential should report

to the press box prior to the game. Photographers are not permitted in the team areas between the 25-yard lines. Photographers are not permitted to enter the bench area at any time. The press box also has a photography work room that will be available before and after the game.

Media Parking

A limited number of media parking spaces are available at Apogee Stadium. Media must request parking passes along with credential requests. Parking passes will be provided only to the organizations that cover North Texas on a regular basis.

Press Box Services
