Head Coach

16th Year ▶ Midwestern State '84

Having established himself as one of the most prominent coaches in the Central Region, John Hedlund, who is in his 16th year at North Texas, has molded the soccer program into one of the nation's elite. Since 1995, Coach Hedlund has led North Texas to 208 wins, which is 29th among active division I coaches.

Last season, the Mean Green finished with a 12-7-2 record, marking the 15th consecutive season that North Texas finished with a winning record. Hedlund celebrated his 200-win milestone with a 2-1 triumph over Baylor on September 11.

During Hedlund's tenure at North Texas he has won 208 games, ranking him 17th among division I women's soccer active coaches with a winning percentage of .704. All-time, he is the 15th-winningest coach among division I coaches. Hedlund is also ranked 29th in victories among active coaches in division I women's soccer.

During his 15 years as the head coach of the Mean Green, Hedlund has seen 52 players selected to the all-conference team, 15 players named all-region, and the Mean Green has never had a losing season in the program's history.

Under Hedlund's leadership North Texas has captured three Sun Belt Conference regular season championships and two Sun Belt Conference Tournament titles. Hedlund has been recognized as the North Texas Coach of the Year by the Dallas Morning News and the Dallas All Sports Association. He was also named the Coach of the Year by the Greater Denton Sports Commission two years in a row.

Hedlund started the program from scratch in 1995 by implementing a game plan that emphasizes recruiting from the surplus of talent available in the Lone Star State. In just 15 years, the Mean Green has vaulted itself into one of the premier programs in the state of Texas.

In 2007, Hedlund led North Texas to its best start in school history with a 13-2 record through the first 15 games. Within the first 15 games the Mean Green had two six-game winning streaks for the first time in school history. North Texas reached the conference tournament championship game for the eighth straight season, a feat that has been unmatched by any other in the Sun Belt Conference.

In 2006, Hedlund guided the Mean Green to its third straight season of 15 wins or more. The Mean Green racked up a 12-game unbeaten streak and a nine-game winning streak last season in reaching the SBC Tournament title game for the seventh straight year.

Hedlund led the Mean Green to its first ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament and a school-record 16 wins in 2004. Hedlund equaled that performance by winning 16 games and leading the Mean Green to back-to-back SBC titles in 2005 and a second straight trip to the NCAA Tournament. Hedlund was also named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. In 2005, North Texas set numerous school records and had the nation's third longest unbeaten streak at 15 games.

At home, North Texas has established a record of dominance, with a record of 81-8-5 since the 2000 season.

Individually Hedlund brought out the best in forward Marilyn Marin as she turned in the best individual season in North Texas history in 2002. Marin led the nation in goals, points, and points per game. She ended her career with 214 career points, tied for 10th in NCAA history, 88 goals, eight in NCAA history, 2.70 points per game, tied for seventh in NCAA history, and 1.11 goals per game, tied for eighth in NCAA history.

His standard for success reached a new high in 2001 when he guided the Mean Green to the Sun Belt Conference's regular-season championship -- the program's first-ever soccer title -- and a 13-5 overall record.

But winning is nothing new to Hedlund and the Mean Green. His teams have been ranked in the Top 10 in the Central Region by Soccer Buzz in 11 of the last 15 years, with the 2005 club posting the school's best-ever record of 16-4-2. Hedlund's program can boast having never had a losing record.

In nine years in the Sun Belt Conference, the Mean Green has also earned the respect of the league's coaches. Thirty-eight different players have been selected all-conference and 27 have been named first-team all-conference since joining the SBC.

Marin and Kendall Juett are the only four-time all-conference selections in North Texas soccer history. Heather Hutyra became the second player at North Texas to be named Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year. Under Hedlund's guidance, four of his players have also been chosen Freshman All-America, including Marin as a first team pick in 2000. Freshman Janaye Woods joined that list she was named the Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year and named to the Freshman All-Region team in 2007.

Under Hedlund, the Mean Green have also succeeded in the classroom, boasting an overall 3.4 team GPA in 2000 and twice being named the school's All-Academic Team in 1998 and 1999.

His association with North Texas began in 1990 as an assistant men's soccer coach. He served briefly as the head coach of the men's program in 1994 before the university discontinued the sport.

In 1995, Hedlund concluded a 12-year professional playing career, in which he played for the New York Express (1984-85), the Dallas Sidekicks (1986-87 and 1992-95) and the Dallas Rockets (1988-91).

A four-year letterwinner at Midwestern State University, Hedlund was twice voted to the NAIA All-America team in college.

The Plano (Tex.) native holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Midwestern State and resides in Argyle (Tex.) with his wife, Julie, and sons Chad and Cole.

Cassidy Acuff

Assistant Coach

First Year ▶ UT-Dallas '06

Cassidy Acuff begins her first year on the University of North Texas soccer staff in 2010.

She is among the elite state coaches

in Texas, serving as the head coach for the U-15 and U-13 ODP teams for North Texas and worked side by side with Gary Williamson, the NT State Coach and several Regional/National coaches through the ODP system, prior to her arrival at North Texas.

Acuff also served as the soccer coach at Dallas Hockaday School since 2005 and won the Southwest Preparatory Conference in 2007 and 2008.

As a player, Acuff played for the prestigious Dallas Texans coached by Hassan Nazari, winning the State Cup twice and also winning the SPC for Hockaday in 2000. From there, she attended Purdue University and played in the Big Ten Conference before transferring back home to finish her college career at the University of Texas at Dallas.

At UT-Dallas, Acuff was the Defensive Player of the Year in 2003 and led the Comets to the regional finals of the NCAA Division III tournament that same year. She was also named team captain in 2003 and 2004.

Acuff received her bachelor's degree in business administration from UT-Dallas in 2006.



Jess Jobe

Assistant Coach

First Year ▶ Fontbonne '09

Jess Jobe begins his first year as an assistant coach with the Mean Green. He will work primarily with the goalkeepers.

Jobe comes to North Texas from Fontbonne University in St. Louis where he served as an assistant coach in the fall semester of 2009 while completing his degree. He received a bachelor's degree in sports management in 2009.

In addition to his duties at North Texas, Jobe also coaches goalkeepers for Triumph FC in Coppell, Texas. He attained a United States Soccer Federation 'D' Coaching License in the summer of 2009.

While attending Fontbonne, Jobe lettered in three varsity sports (soccer, basketball, golf). In soccer he earned first-team All-SLIAC honors twice and first-team All-SLIAC-Tournament honors three times. Jobe helped Fontbonne win two SLIAC Conference Titles (2006 and 2008) and was team captain his senior year.

Jobe is a Denton High School graduate where he played soccer and earned first-team all-district honors twice and was named the district's goalkeeper of the year his junior season. After graduation Jobe went on to play at Georgia Southern University before transferring to Fontbonne.

Jason Hines starts his second year as a volunteer assistant coach at North Texas in 2010.

A Denton native, Hines played soccer all four years at Ryan High School and was an all-district selection as a junior and a senior. Hines left Denton to play soccer at Southern Nazarene University for two years.

In addition to his coaching duties at North Texas, Hines coaches club soccer in the area and has worked Mean Green soccer camps during the summers. He holds a USSF coaching license.

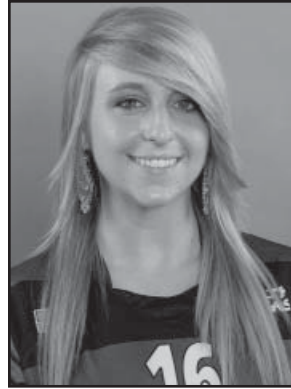

↳ north texas hall of fame

The North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame was established in 1981 to acknowledge former athletes, coaches and administrators whose accomplishments have brought credit to the University of North Texas and had a special impact on Mean Green athletics.

The current North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame is located in the North Texas Coliseum, also known as the Super Pit, and features plaques that highlight the accomplishments of those inducted. There are also plans in place for a second location in the new North Texas Athletic Department Building that will provide another place for former Mean Green athletes to socialize and come together.

Inductees are honored at the annual Hall of Fame Breakfast the morning of North Texas' homecoming game, and again on the field at the game. The North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame stands for many things, foremost being sportsmanship, character and integrity. Since the Hall of Fame's creation, 154 people have been inducted.

In the last five years, three women's soccer players have been inducted to the North Texas Athletic Hall of Fame. Krista Davey became the first soccer player to be inducted in 2005, followed by Christy Johnson in 2007 and Marilyn Marin in 2008.

↳ Women's Soccer Inductees

KRISTA DAVEY (2005)

Krista Davey became the first women's soccer player to be inducted in the North Texas Hall of Fame. Davey was one of six former Mean Green student-athletes inducted into the 2005 class. Davey was a four-year letterwinner with the women's soccer team (1996-99), joining the program one year after its inaugural campaign. The three-time First Team All-Big West Conference selection led the Mean Green to a 51-22-3 record during her career and helped build the foundation for a program that has never had a losing season. Davey was named to the Soccer Buzz First Team All-Central Region Team in 1997 and 1998 and still ranks among the top five players in every major statistical category.

CHRISTY JOHNSON (2007)

Christy Johnson, a four-year letterwinner, was one of the pillars during the early years of North Texas women's soccer. Johnson left North Texas in 2000 as the all-time leader in goals, points, shots, and games started in her four-year career. She was a freshman All-American in 1997 and first-team all-central region player that year. In 1997 Johnson exploded for 22 goals during the season, which ranked sixth nationally. She was a four-time first-team all-conference player at North Texas and was the first player in school history to be a four-time all-conference selection. She is third all-time at North Texas with 45 career goals and third in points with 112.

MARILYN MARIN (2008)

Marilyn Marin ended her fabulous career with every offensive record in school history while leaving her mark on the NCAA. Marin had 214 career points, tied for 10th in NCAA history, 88 goals, eighth in NCAA history, 2.70 points per game, tied for seventh in NCAA history, and 1.11 goals per game, tied for eighth in NCAA history. In 2002 Marin turned in the best season in North Texas soccer history. She led the nation in points (67), goals (26), and points per game (3.53). She was the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year in 2002 and 2003 along with being named the Freshman of the Year in 2000. Marin was a four-time first-team all-conference selection and a four-time all-central region selection. Marin is the first player in league history to be named to the first-team all-conference four straight years and capture back-to-back Player of the Year honors. In 2000, she was named to the Freshman All-America first-team after pouring in 24 goals, six assists, and 54 points on the season. In 2003, she had her third 20-goal season with 23 goals, 14 assists, and 60 points. She had 11 hat tricks for her career along with 23 games where she scored two goals or more.

↳ 2009 Season In Review

The 2009 season saw the North Texas women's soccer team continue its unbroken streak of 15 consecutive winning seasons, dating back to the program's inception. The Mean Green also reached the SBC Tournament semifinals for the 10th consecutive season.

The Mean Green opened the season by winning four of their first five games, including perhaps the most dramatic win of the season at home against Texas Tech. In spite of losing both Lauren Shockey and Kara Brooks to injury, North Texas was able to control the shot chart in regulation and overtime. Freshman Michelle Young kick-started her second-team All-Sun Belt campaign with the first goal of her young career in the 12th minute. The Mean Green appeared to be charging toward the promised land until Tiffini Smith equalized the match for Texas Tech in the 74th minute. Kendall Juett clinched NT's third consecutive win over a Big 12-squad with her 10th game-winner five minutes into the extra frame.

The 2009 season welcomed another milestone in the Mean Green's next time out when head coach John Hedlund secured his 200th victory in a 2-1 triumph over Baylor. Michelle Young led the way, extending her hot streak with both of NT's goals. Goalkeeper Mandy Hall recorded a season-high eight saves in the process. The win was North Texas' fourth straight over a Big 12 opponent, a streak that continues into 2010, and third consecutive victory over Baylor.

The Mean Green opened the Sun Belt Conference schedule on a tear. Behind great defense and timely scoring, North Texas began conference play 7-0-2. The Mean Green surrendered only three goals during that span, while netting 19 goals of their own.

Highlights of that streak include a 4-0 blowout of Louisiana-Monroe, and a dramatic comeback against FIU. Trailing 2-0 late in the match, Rachel Turpin scored her first career goal to bring the score to 2-1. Just three minutes later, Kendall Juett secured the tie with her 28th career goal.

Following the comeback at FIU, North Texas ripped off a season-high four game winning streak. North Texas shut out South Alabama and Troy at home, and followed that up with a perfect weekend in Arkansas with wins over UALR and Arkansas State.

The 2009 season continued benchmarks of North Texas' success, winning at home and in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament. The Mean Green enjoyed an 8-1 home record, pushing its all-time home mark to 117-19-7. Since 2000, North Texas is 83-7-5 at Mean Green Village, holding a .911 winning percentage.

The Sun Belt Conference Tournament was held in Boca Raton, Fla., and saw possibly North Texas' most dramatic win of the season. The Mean Green faced Middle Tennessee in the opening round of the tournament. The teams had duled to a scoreless draw just two weeks earlier, so a tight contest was a surprise to no one.

That theme continued early in the match, when the teams again played to a scoreless tie. Middle Tennessee's Vanessa Mueggler ended 177:13 of clean sheets with a shot off a cross from Hope Suominen to give the Blue Raiders the advantage. Facing elimination, North Texas was forced to earn a comeback victory for the first time all season, a task they had failed to do in six previous attempts (0-5-1), and they did just that. Just five minutes later, Shannon Gorrie netted the second goal of her career from Young to even the score. In the game's 87th minute, Young found the back of the net and advanced the Mean Green to their 10th consecutive Sun Belt Conference Tournament semifinals with a goal from the left side of the box.

Young's fourth game-winner pushed the Mean Green's record to a perfect 10-0 in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament first round. In the semifinals, the eighth-seeded UALR Trojans avenged a 2-1 defeat at the hands of the Mean Green earlier in the season with a 1-0 triumph to end North Texas' season.

- ↳ Since the program's birth in 1995, the Mean Green has never had a losing season. North Texas' 15-year combined record stands at 208-83-16 for a .709 winning percentage.
- ↳ The 2009 continued the winning tradition by posting the program's 15th winning season and advancing to the semifinals of the conference tournament for the 10th straight year.
- ↳ Kendall Juett became the second player in school history to be named first-team all-conference all four years.
- ↳ The 2007 team had the best start in school history with a 13-2 mark through 15 games and had two separate six-game winning streaks, the first time in school history that has happened. North Texas advanced to its eighth straight SBC Tournament finals, the only school in league history to play in the championship game each year.
- ↳ Freshman Janaye Woods was named the 2007 SBC Freshman of the Year.
- ↳ The 2008 North Texas squad captured its sixth straight season of 15 wins or more.
- ↳ The 2007 North Texas squad captured its fifth straight season of 15 wins or more and advanced to Sun Belt Conference Championship for the eighth straight year.
- ↳ The 2005 squad tied a school record with 16 wins and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year after capturing the program's second straight Sun Belt Conference Tournament Championship.
- ↳ John Hedlund won Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year honors in 2004 and 2005.
- ↳ Heather Hutyra became the youngest player in the Sun Belt Conference to earn Player of the Year honors as a sophomore in 2005.
- ↳ North Texas has been awarded conference freshman of year honors four times. Janaye Woods won in 2007, Kelli Lunsford received the award in 2005, Heather Hutyra was named freshman of the year in 2004, and Marilyn Marin received the honor in 2000.
- ↳ The 2004 squad set a school record with 16 wins and its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament after capturing the program's first Sun Belt Conference Tournament Championship.
- ↳ The 2003 squad tied a then school record with 15 wins and went a perfect 11-0 at home. The undefeated season at home was the first since 2001 and the third in the program's history.

- ↳ Marilyn Marin became the first North Texas player to win back-to-back Player of the Year honors in the Sun Belt Conference. She was also named to the first-team all-conference squad for a fourth straight year.
- ↳ In 2002, North Texas was second in the nation in goals per game and forward Marilyn Marin, who led the nation in goals, points, and points per game, was named the Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year.
- ↳ In 2001, the Mean Green captured its first Sun Belt Conference regular-season championship in just the second year of the league sponsoring women's soccer. North Texas went a perfect 5-0 at home against Sun Belt opponents en route to a unblemished 7-0 home record for the season.
- ↳ North Texas boasts three players who have been named freshman All-Americans.
- ↳ Eight different Mean Green players have been named to the All-Central Region teams.
- ↳ A total of 25 different players have been voted a combined 44 times to all-conference honors.
