Last Time Out

Mean Green Down No. 59 OSU 4-3

TULSA, Okla. – Mean Green tennis downed the No. 59 Oklahoma State Cowgirls 4-3 Sunday afternoon at Tulsa's Michael D. Case Tennis Center.

North Texas (1-1) downed its third ranked opponent in the last two years after taking the doubles point and collecting three singles wins.

Junior Paula Dinuta and senior Amy Joubert started the afternoon when they took down the duo of C.C. Sardinha and Malika Rose 8-3 in the No. 3 doubles slot.

After the team of Nadia Lee and Madura Ranganathan fell 8-3 to OSU's Nataliya Shatkovskaya and Kanyapat Narattana 8-3, junior Irina Paraschiv and sophomore Barbora Vykydalova overcame a deficit of 7-4 to capture the doubles point with a 9-7 win, by winning five straight games.

In singles, Oklahoma State (1-1) took the first two matches and claimed a 2-1 lead before Irina Paraschiv evened the match at two a piece with a 6-3, 6-3 victory over Shatkovskaya.

Joubert followed her lead, capturing a tough first set victory before cruising in the second set on winning the match (7-6, 6-1).

From there, Dinuta rebounded from a tough loss on Saturday to claim the match clinching win over Sarah Meghoufel in three sets, 3-6, 6-4, 6-4.

North Texas will be back in action on Friday, Jan. 28, when they participate in the program's first ITA Kick-Off Weekend in Berkeley, Calif., against the No. 10 Cal-Bears.

Sujay Lama, who led the University of Illinois to

five NCAA Tournament appearances, took over the reigns of the North Texas Tennis program on June 14, 2006, and it didn't take him long to make an impact.

Lama led North Texas to a 17-6 record in the spring of 2009, its best record since '86-87. In 2007, he led the program to its best fall season in history. The Mean Green turned the heads of the nation's premier programs, notching individual wins over Ohio State, Kentucky, LSU, Oklahoma State, Baylor, Texas Tech and many others in the fall of '07.

"I am very excited about the opportunity to work at the University of North Texas," said Lama. "This is a tremendous academic institution in a great location. We have one of the premier tennis facilities in the country and an athletic director who is dynamic and has great vision. Our goal is to build a tennis program that demands excellence on the courts and in the classroom. We want to be one of best programs in the country but make sure our student-athletes enjoy the process and the family atmosphere we have built."

Lama compiled a dual-meet record of 108-84, including a 57-25 mark in Big Ten play, during his eight-year career as the Illini's head coach. In addition to leading the school to five NCAA

Tournament appearances, his team ranked as high as No. 16 in the nation in the spring of 2004.

North Texas is the third stop in Lama's collegiate coaching career, also serving as the top assistant at the Univ. of Florida from 1995 to 1998 before taking over at Illinois.

Lama turned the Illinois tennis program around right away, taking the Illini from a ninth-place finish in the Big Ten the year before his arrival to a third-place finish in his first year at the helm. In 2003-04 the Illini went 17-6, posting their best winning percentage since Illinois' first team went 6-0 in 1975. Additionally, Lama led Illinois to a victory over topranked Duke, 4-3, at the UI Atkins Tennis Center in 2003.

Among the other milestones the Illinois women's tennis program reached under Lama is winning its first-ever NCAA Tournament match in May of 2001.

During Lama's time at Illinois, he coached the tennis program's first Big Ten Freshman of the Year, the Rookie of the Year in the Midwest Region, nine All-Big Ten players, four Big Ten Medal of Honor players, 13 ITA Scholar-Athletes and two Academic All-Americans. UI women's tennis players earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition 42 times under Lama.

While at Florida, he helped lead the Gators to two NCAA titles, three SEC crowns and three undefeated dual-match seasons. Lama was honored for his contribution as the 1997 ITA National Assistant Coach of the Year in the South Region.

Prior to Florida, Lama was the Senior Staff
Professional at the Van Der Meer Tennis Center in
Hilton Head, S.C., where he worked with the elite
player development program (for touring pros and
top junior players) from 1992-95. A noted teacher
and clinician, Lama has worked at tennis camps
across the United States, Europe and Asia. He has
earned the highest certification level with the USPTR
and the USPTA, and is a USTA Certified High
Performance Coach.

He was a traveling coach on the WTA tour for several players including two top twenty ranked Amanda Coetzer (South Africa) and Naoko Sawamatsu (Japan). Lama has coached at 12 grand slam events including Wimbledon, U.S Open, Australian Open and French Open.

In his playing career, Lama was the top-ranked player in Nepal from 1989-91 and reached No. 50 in the International Tennis Federation (ITF) junior world singles rankings. He represented his country in several international tournaments, including the Asian Games in Beijing, China in 1990.

The Nepal native attended Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, from 1988-92 and was a two-time Volvo Collegiate All-American in singles (1991-92). He also earned Senior Player of the Year honors in the Midwest Region in 1992 and was ranked No. 5 in NCAA Division III singles. Lama dominated the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference the four years he competed at Luther.

He won the league's singles and doubles titles and took conference MVP honors all four years of his collegiate career, leading his team to four IIAC titles. Lama put together a career singles record of 104-18 and captured two Rolex Midwest Regionals (1989 and 1991), while advancing to the semifinals of the Rolex National Intercollegiate Indoor Championship in 1991. Lama also made three NCAA Tournament apperances. He was inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in the fall of 2002.

He earned his bachelor's degree from Luther College in 1992, earning GTE/CoSIDA Academic All-America honors during his time there. He was the recipient of the U.S./Nepal Educational Foundation Scholarship from 1990-92. Lama has traveled in more than 50 countries and is fluent in English, German, Hindi and Nepalese. He has lived five or more years on three continents (Asia, Europe and North America).

Recently, Lama has lent his time and expertise to a unique venture he calls "Project Nepal". He has helped raise over \$12,000 each year to fund the education of 67 orphanage children in his hometown of Nepal (www.supportprojectnepal.com).

Lama is also currently writing a bi-weekly column for Nepalitimes. His column, Game Point, has been well received in his native country and throughout the world for its insight and expertise on the game of tennis and life.

Lama and his wife, Lynne, reside in Corinth with their nine-year-old daughter, Priya and four-year-old son, Siddhartha.

Signing Release: North Texas tennis head coach Sujay Lama announced the signing of Isabel Bos, a former three-time top-20 player from the Netherlands, Thursday afternoon.
Bos will begin her career with Mean Green tennis during the 2011 spring dual match season in January. "Isabel is a powerful player who is very strong and athletic," said Lama. "However, as I got to know her and see her compete, it's her mental toughness and attitude that stood out. We are delighted to have her join the Mean Green family. Her addition gives us the depth needed to become a top 50 team in the country and make a run for our second straight conference championship. She will make an immediate impact both on and off the court." A native of Noordwijk, Netherlands, Bos reached her career high ranking of No. 6 in the under 16 junior national girl's singles rankings. In addition to the national ranking, she was ranked in the top-20 in the Netherlands in the 12 and 14 age groups. Bos has also been a two-sport star, having played at a high level of senior national hockey in her native country. "I noticed the performance of the team over the past year and the ambition to continue to climb in the rankings of Division I tennis are goals I want to be a part of," Bos said. "After meeting with coach Lama in Holland and after our conversations throughout the recruiting process, I was completely convinced that the Mean Green tennis team should become my new family for the next four years."
Bos will join Carolina Barboza as the only freshmen on the 2011 spring roster.
