We're No. 1: Latest rankings for lowest student debt reveal no institution anywhere is doing it better than UNT Dallas

The statistic we are most proud of is the one that just bumped UNT Dallas from No. 2 in the nation to No. 1. UNT Dallas now ranks No. 1 nationally for lowest student debt among public universities upon graduation, according to <a href="LendEDU">LendEDU</a>'s annual student loan debt rankings. The rankings, which were posted earlier this fall, have been revised due to a reporting error by another institution, and UNT Dallas moved from No. 2 to No. 1. 

UNT Dallas College of Law students pull off dominant performance at prestigious statewide writing competition

The University of North Texas at Dallas College of Law continues to make a name for itself as an emerging force in the state on the strength of its students. Kamran Anwar set a new standard last week by winning the 2018 The Paper Chase Legal Writing Competition, which crowns the best practical writer in all of the Texas law schools. All three UNT Dallas College of Law students that entered the competition finished in the top six. Anwar, an alumnus of UNT Dallas, beat out Darrick Monson of the University of Texas, and Aaron Diaz of St. Mary's University School of Law. Created by Baylor Law School and judged by the Texas Young Lawyer Association (TYLA), first place came with \$7,000 in cash prizes. Only UT Law School and South Texas College of Law placed at least two competitors in the top 10.

This December, Gasko will be one of just two educators representing American universities at the Higher Education Social Innovation Program on the island of Ekskäret in Stockholm, Sweden, from Dec. 3-7. This initial gathering of global educational leaders seeks to reimagine how the world trains and supports people on the front lines of the helping professions. Gasko incorporates strategies to strengthen internal resiliency and well-being into his UNT Dallas curriculum, and he was invited to present his unique approach, called *Thirdspace*, during this international meeting of the minds.

Visiting school campuses and actively engaging in conversations with principals, teachers, students and school board officials reminds us that we have shared responsibility to champion change."

Third Annual Criminal Justice Day brings 1,000+ high school students and 70+ government agencies to campus

A founding program at UNT Dallas, the Criminal Justice department pulled off its third annual Career Expo November 2, on a stunning fall day that included 1,100 students representing eight area school districts. The CJ Day event is one of the largest of its kind in North Texas, attracting 75 local, state, federal and private criminal justice agencies that set up informational tables inside Founders Hall. Outside, was where the real show took place, with the various branches of law enforcement displaying their heavy-duty vehicles. Texas Department of Public Safety, the Dallas Police Department and CareFlite all flew in helicopters that landed on the soccer field. The Mesquite Police Department brought its mobile command center and numerous other departments and agencies showed off bomb squads, K-9 units and various law enforcement and emergency vehicles.
